* Nightly Debrief presenters will include: I-LYA Coaches, Course PRO, Club Coaches and I-LYA Judge

* Sand Volleyball on Tuesday Night

* Every night the check-in Parent of the Day (POD) must talk to each individual sailor, before signing them in.

*Parents & Club Coaches may not talk to their sailors until the PINK flag is lowered at the end of the day.

*Each club is permitted to send 9 sailors. All sailors over 9 will need to fill out the Additional Competitor Petition. They will be accepted on a first-received basis; priority will be given to Thistle teams.

I-LYA's Yachtsmen's Fund is the charity for all I-LYA member clubs and their members! The "Honor Roll" may be found in The Fund's pages in the I-LYA Directory each year. Is your club among them? If not, have your club consider joining right now. Individuals can join as well.

This Fund contributes substantially each year to introduce and educate new junior power and sailing youth to the sport, competition and fun of yachting. Shouldn't that be of interest to every club and its members, to make our youth comfortable on and in the water? Many of our clubs are finding their memberships are dwindling. It's important that each club and member do something to educate our children and their friends so they continue to enjoy the water safely and maybe competitively for many years to come. Call it "Give Back" if you like.

I-LYA's three summer regattas are educational and teaching opportunities for all I-LYA youth. The Fund uses its deductible contributions to substantially reduce the costs of sending our youth to these regattas so as to not be such a burden to some of our families. To encourage youth participation, we also grant scholarships to the top three or four power and sail skippers and crew who compete in these events. The presentations at these events are the high for winners. Think about it - if a child grows up having become comfortable in water events, there is more likelihood that s/he will continue boating after leaving home. Sailing youth may select a power boat, or a youth trained in power may decide to sail, but boating education will be of benefit to all of our youth and will produce future members for our clubs.

I-LYA has had up to 200 youth compete at Put-in-Bay's Junior Sail and Powerboat Weeks. The winners in three classes of sailboats go on to the semi-finals, and those winners go on to the U.S. Championships. The Fund helps these winners with their registration fees and some travel expense for these higher events. It also provides coaches at our level. Think of your contributions working this way - if up to 200 power and sail youth compete at our I-LYA level, how many more are back at our clubs learning about water safety, boating, etc?

So you can see how expanding our help is important to our I-LYA boating youth. JANE O'BRIEN MIDWEST REGIONAL SAILING PROGRAM SYMPOSIUM

Twenty eight program directors, race team coordinators, parents, and sailors representing 15 different I-LYA clubs and community programs gathered at Sandusky Sailing Club on Saturday, February 23rd for the Midwest Regional Sailing Programs Symposium sponsored by I-LYA and the Yachtsmen's Fund. The round table discussion was moderated by Stu Gilfillen, the Sailing Programs Administrator for US Sailing.

When Stu travelled here from Rhode Island he brought more than a box of printed hand outs; his wealth of knowledge helped guide the discussion to the mutual benefit of everyone there. We learned that our sailing programs run the gamut from a one week all-volunteer camp at Berlin to an adult/youth program at Hoover with 2012 enrollment just shy of 400 and everything in between. I-LYA has both club and community based programs. We have both volunteer and paid directors. We have long-established programs, some just starting up, and some re-starting. As much an ambassador as a moderator. Stu was able to keep the conversation pertinent for all while emphasizing how US Sailing could help. The sharing of resources started at the RSPS will continue as the I-LYA Junior Sailing Committee focuses on facilitating training opportunities, the creation and sharing of safety plans, and employment outreach. The demonstrated spirit of cooperation and willingness to share successes. frustrations, and resources signals an exciting future for our I-LYA Junior Programs. ONWARD: Scott Matthews "arrives" at the 1906 ILYA Race Week



Scott Matthews' personal yacht "Onward" went on a 9000-mile journey around the eastern half of America. This was a voyage of romance and daring. Just 70 feet long powered by a Lozier engine with about 40 horsepower, "Onward" navigated the rivers, canals, coastal waterways and open-ocean on its epic journey of adventure that would lead Scott (S.J.) Matthews back to Put-in-Bay for the 1906 ILYA Bay Week!

An Epic Journey

People of vision always seem to find a way to succeed. In the 1890's Bascom, Ohio was certainly not the epicenter of the marine industry; in fact it was hardly even on the map. An innovator among his peers, young Scott Matthews had a vision of what was required to create a swift and resilient boat that was pleasant to look at. He developed a basic hull style that was strong, moved through the water cleanly and was attractive to the eye. His passion for boat building had grown his small fledgling company in just a few short years from basement dreams full to production. By 1900 his boat designs were gaining national from vachtsmen attention countrywide. In late 1904, burnt out from the stress of growing a

successful company, Matthews envisioned a yearlong "relaxing and restful" boat trip from the farm fields of Ohio, down the Mississippi around Florida up the East Coast and back again to the Great Lakes. A novel trip for the times perhaps, and

one that was certain to be fraught with drama and triumphs along the way. This was hardly a vacation for the timid. On November 11th the sleek 70 foot yacht "Onward" was ready to disembark on the first leg of its epic journey. The boat was sent by rail from Bascom on a specially cradle designed with the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad to Peoria Illinois. Matthews, his wife, three children. brother-in-law. nanny and a small crew boarded beautiful custom the built "Onward" to began a life changing journey south starting on the Illinois River. This voyage not only provided a transcendent vision for the entire Matthews family and crew, but also for a future generation of boaters that followed the voyage in the periodical "The Motor Boat". The "Onward" arrived on the first day of the "ILYA Meet" after this amazing voyage. Writer Ferris Dyar of The Toledo Blade reported; "One of the pleasing features of the first day of the meet was the arrival of the launch "Onward", Captain S.J. Matthews. The Onward is one of the best appearing powerboats that has ever entered the Inter-Lake squadron, and flies the flag of the Lakewood and Toledo Yacht clubs."

Between the Waves-This wonderful story is told in greater depth in a new display at the Sandusky Maritime Museum through the revelations included in the log of the "Onward" journal printed in "The Motor Boat" written by Scott Matthews and augmented by the personal recollections of Bob Reynolds, Matthews' grandson and longtime employee of the Matthews Boat Company. The story is supported with photos taken by Matthews' brother-in-law Simon Miller, and a short documentary produced by filmmaker Peter Huston to help tell the story. The weave of the captain's log with the Matthews Boat Company history allows us to expand on the shake down cruise of the "Onward" as they became the foundation of boats to come for Matthews Boat Company. Matthews' log explains how they continued to learn about the important requirements that his boat needed to be a steady. efficient and dependable cruiser. The creature comforts, the space general allocations and the dynamics of the boat are part of the descriptions and flavor of the journey's tribulations. This new display, curated by Bob Reynolds, brings this wonderful piece of Ohio history life highlighting to Matthew's amazing innovations juxtaposed with his yearlong adventure. It was no accident that Scott and the Matthews Boat Company "arrived" at 1906 ILYA Race Week.
