Your endorsement for my consideration as I-LYA Trustee would be greatly appreciated. Thank you.



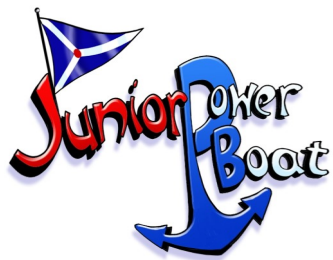
To the I-LYA Nominating Committee:

SAIL REGATTA

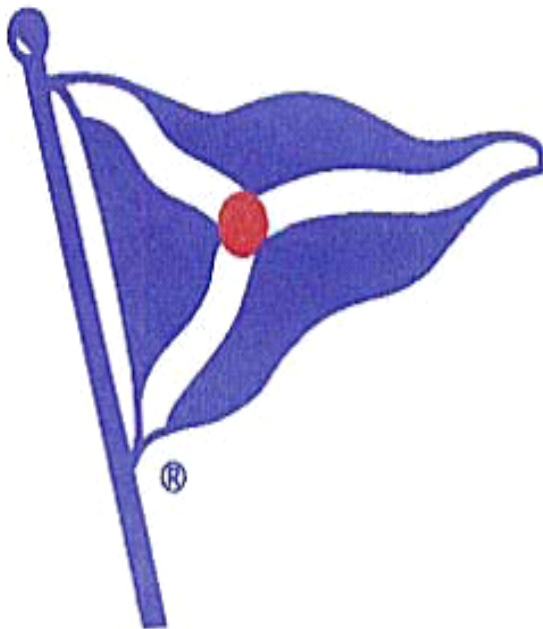
