The GLCC Harbor Reports: A Cruiser's Best Friend


Ever enter a strange harbor all the while crossing your fingers and hoping your charts and chart plotter will keep you off a lurking sandbar or an unforgiving rock? Ever tried to plan a summer cruise and end up frustrated trying to remember which of a dozen internet tabs you last looked at? Well, help is on the way! The Great Lakes Cruising Club's *Harbor Reports* --- the single best source of information for cruising anywhere on the Great Lakes.

The GLCC publishes over 1,200 *Harbor Reports*. They cover big cities, small harbors, islands and anchorages all the way from Montreal to Duluth. In Lake Erie alone there are 66 separate *Harbor Reports*.

Because these *Harbor Reports* are online, downloadable and totally portable, they are an invaluable cruising resource. Many GLCC members have their *Harbor Reports* readily available on a portable electronic device and

use them to guide their boats safely into new harbors. Written by club members who are "locals" or frequent visitors, the *Harbor Reports* give you reliable and accurate information you can trust. In addition to guiding you safely into a new port, the GLCC's *Harbor Reports* also let you know what to expect once you're in and tied up. These reports have it all --- from where to get fuel and marine services, to listings of local restaurants and attractions. The *Harbor Reports* also contain many charts and pictures like this bird's eye view of Erie PA and this street scene from Geneva-On-The-Lake.

Approaches


Approaching the harbor from either the east or west, it is best to stay at least a half mile offshore. Northern winds cause a severe chop due to the backwash from the sheer cliffs that dominate the shoreline from either side of the harbor entrance.

From the west, the bright lights on shore make it difficult to see the range lights. However, there is a cluster of high-rise apartment buildings about 3 miles past the harbor entrance. The course to Rocky River from Avon Point is 103° T and this "W" landmark would be slightly to the left of the course line.

From the east, the range light is more clearly visible because of the dark backdrop of the cliff behind.

Planning a summer's cruise has never been easier if you have the GLCC's *Harbor Reports* at your side.


