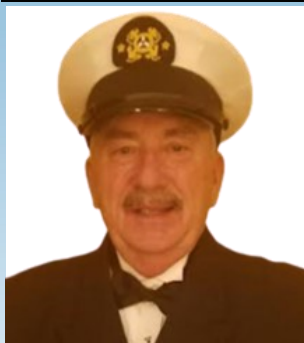




COMMODORE'S REPORT

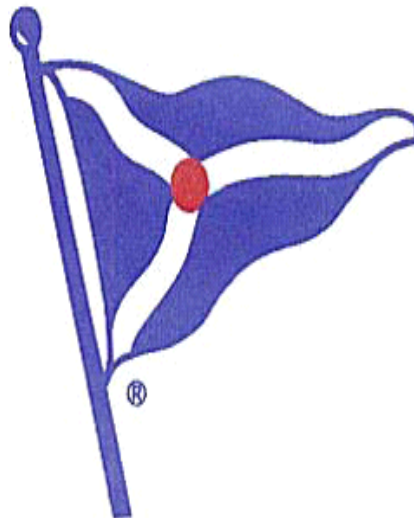
Vice Commodore's Corner...Dale Vanderford

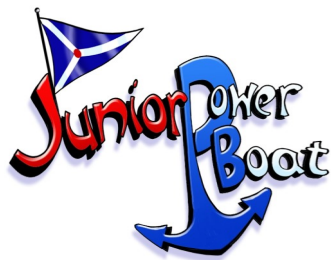

The 2023 I-LYA Junior Championship is in the books. Eighty-nine sailors descended on Put-In-Bay the third Sunday in July and started a great week of racing. We had twenty-seven 420 teams and thirty-five ILCA/Laser sailors. Multiple races were sailed on Monday because of concerns for light wind on Tuesday. Tuesday's weather predictions came through with only one race able to be sailed. Wednesday and Thursday saw great racing with nine Gold Fleet races and eight Silver Fleet races. Thank you the entire race committee for an excellent week on the water.

During the banquet Wednesday night, the non-racing awards were handed out. The votes were tallied from the icebreaker skits on Sunday night with xxxx being voted best skit despite a solid effort from North Cape Yacht Club. Shipshape flag went to Leatherlips YC, good job keeping your rooms clean. The Team Sportsmanship award went to the smallest team of the regatta, Buckeye Lake YC. Good job teams on your collective efforts at the regatta.

The individual sportsmanship awards, as voted on by the sailors, were a highlight of the banquet. The Commodore Art O'Hara Memorial Trophy for Female Sportsmanship, presented by Peggy Webber, was awarded to Kellie Keane (VBC). Kellie's award included a gorgeous bracelet. The Ray Green Award Male Sportsmanship, presented by Dan Clevenger, was awarded to Joe Lavelle (CYC). Joe received a magnificent watch as part of his award. Matt and Tracy Davis presented the Thanks for Caring award, on behalf of the Davis family, to Jane O'Brian for her years of service to the regatta and junior sailing. Congratulations to the recipients and thank you for demonstrating the type of spirit our sport relies on.

420 Gold Fleet was won by Jacob and Rider Myers from Put-In-Bay YC. Laser Gold Fleet champion was Nick Crull who was awarded the Van Heeckeren award. Finishing fourth in the ILCA/Laser class, Evelyn Hannah was awarded the John H Backus Memorial Trophy for the top finishing female single handed sailor. 1st Place in Silver Fleet 420 Mia Eisma and Graham Newbauer while Lee McBride was 1st in the ILCA/Laser Silver Fleet. Congratulations to all the racers. Lady Dar Burgoyne (with a video appearance by Com. Duane Burgoyne) awarded the Burgoyne Award for Perseverance to Lee McBride for her performance at the regatta. Lee came back to win the silver fleet after re-aggravating an injury Monday during sailing. In addition to sailing, Samantha York, Graham Newbauer, Jacob Myers, Bryor Burke, Charlie Shade were elected as youth representatives to the 2023-2024 I-LYA Junior Council while Nadia Reynolds was elected as the coach representative.

Thank you again to all the participants for competing at the 2023 I-LYA Junior Championship. A big thank you to all the volunteers who come to make this regatta work as well as it does. They didn't give me enough room in the newsletter to thank you all individually. I would like to thank Linda and Mark Sprenger (PCYC) for all the work they did as co-chairs. Without their help the regatta would not have gone as smoothly as it did. Now, I'd like to hand this regatta off to Angela Zoes, our vice-chair, and Edgewater YC for an ever better 2024 JBW.

SAIL REGATTA

Chubb US Youth Triplehanded Championship

On August 10th - 13th, Kaden Kirby, Kellie Keane, Molly Keane & Josie Kirby represented US Sailing Area E, the I-LYA and Vermilion Boat Club at the Chubb U.S. Youth Triplehanded Championship in Seabrook, Texas. 19 teams spanning from Hawaii to Maine and everywhere in-between came together at Lakewood Yacht Club to race their club fleet of RS21s. The RS21 is 21ft. in length and aimed to perform at the highest level of racing with an asymmetrical spinnaker designed to plane off the wind.

Conditions on Clear Lake ranged from 18 knots of breeze on the first day to 2 knots on the last day with 100-plus-degree heat the whole week. New this year, the Sears Cup doubled in size, from 11 teams to 22 teams, allowing each Area to send up to two teams to the National Championship.

The Chubb U.S. Youth Triplehanded Championship for the Sears Cup is US Sailing's National Championship for three-person youth teams (occasionally four-person boats are used like this year), and serves as a pathway into keelboat racing, focusing exclusively on bridging the gap between the small boats typically raced by youth and the larger, multi-person boats typically raced by adults.

First sailed in 1921, the Sears Cup is US Sailing's oldest national championship trophy and the original youth sailing national championship. The National Championship regatta is typically held in early August, with the Area Qualifier regattas taking place earlier in the year, typically in June and July. This year's Area E event was hosted by Cleveland Yachting Club and was sailed in thistles in July.

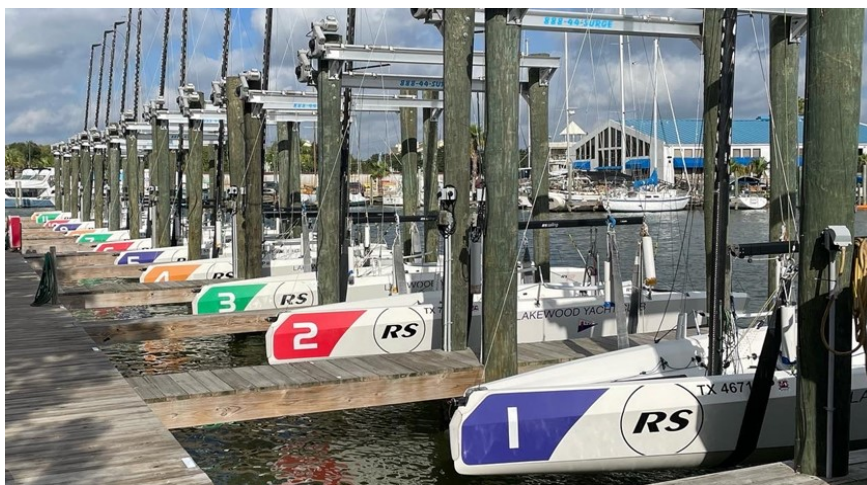

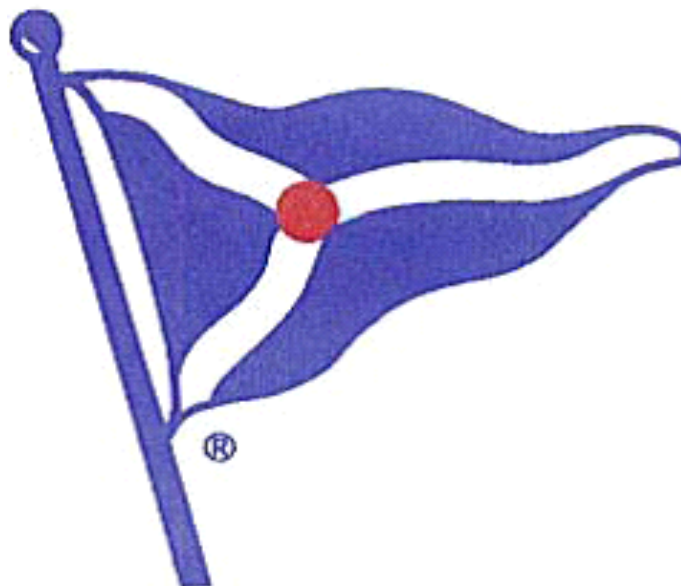

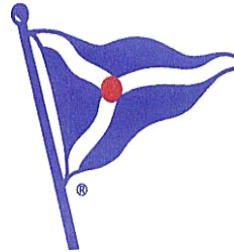
