The Sail Regatta again experienced sunny skies, but unfortunately limited wind. It was great to hear that the Deep-Water races experienced an increase in participation. Overall participation was down somewhat, perhaps due to the increased participation in the 100th Port Huron to Mackinac Race two weeks earlier. We are seeking an increase in 2025! 


