national Youth Regatta from December 27 to December 30, 2013. We had 240 boats in our Opti fleet. There were 720 boats total from 23 countries with 27 states represented. We were able to get in 11 races in 3 of the 4 regatta days.

The first day we had 12 to 14 knots with gusts of up to 16 knots with rain. The second day we had 15 to 18 knots with gusts up to 20 knots with a very confused sea and big waves and more rain. The third day the wind was 10 to 14 knots and to complete the day, more rain! The fourth day we never left land due to no wind. I was very glad we got eleven races in during the previous three days.

We enjoyed an ice cream social before the awards. I was able to hang onto my 2nd place overall with three 1st places and three 2nd places with a total of 29 points in 11 races. My highest finish in an international event! I was glad I had the opportunity to participate in the clinic before the regatta. It was helpful.

SANDUSKY SAILING CLUB AWARDED NATIONAL TROPHY

The US Sailing Association has awarded the St. Petersburg Yacht Club Trophy for excellence in race management to the Sandusky Sailing Club (SSC) for its exceptional organization of the 2013 Thistle Class National Championship.

The club was asked to host the nationals after Hurricane Sandy severely damaged the original host club. SSC rallied under short notice to host 123 Thistles during the six-day event in August which was comprised of Junior's, Women's, and National Championship divisions. The Thistle is a high-performance one-design racing sailboat that is generally sailed with a three person crew.

"This is an exceptional honor for our Club, in particular because it is based on ballots submitted by regatta competitors. We had tremendous support from our club membership - it was truly a team effort," said SSC Commodore Sjoerd-Jan VanderHorst. "We have always believed that SSC has among the best racing and race committee on Lake Erie, and now the regatta competitors have voted that we have among the best in the country."

Competitors were enthusiastic in their praise of SSC's race management. From race committee work to on-shore support, and club facilities to social events, SSC was commended for its overall professionalism and first-class standing as a national championship host. The race management team also proved to be adequately responsive to challenging wind conditions and stringent class rules. The race committee, led by Principal Race Officer Jim Tichenor, ran a total of 14 races over the course of the regatta. Other key organizers were regatta chairman and

2013 SSC Commodore Sjoerd-Jan VanderHorst, SSC Race Committee chairman Jim Keane, and protest committee chairman George Griswold.

In accepting the award in Captiva, Fla. on October 18, Jim Keane and Kathy Keane VanderHorst, cochairperson of the Thistle Regatta,

credited the over 100 volunteers who worked to make the on- and off-the-water events a success. Through cooperation with the City of Sandusky and local businesses, over 360 visitors enjoyed Sandusky and its attractions for the week.

Emblematic of excellence in race management, the St. Petersburg Yacht Club Trophy was awarded originally by St. Petersburg Yacht Club in the late 1960s to recognize the club which ran the best regatta. The trophy was retired for several years and was donated to US Sailing in 1977. The winner is selected on the basis of race management superiority and evaluation by participating skippers.

In addition to hosting Thistle Nationals and its annual local and re-

gional racing schedule, SSC has also recently hosted the 2013 Interlake Sailing Class National Championship and the 2012 United States Optimist Dinghy Association National Championship (sailed by competitors age 7-15).
