MICHIGAN PUBLIC ACT 62 REVISES RANDOM BOAT STOPS FOR SAFETY INSPECTIONS

April 30, 2012, Livonia, Mich. - With Governor Rick Snyder's signature on February 23, 2012, House Bill 5110 sponsored by Representative Richard LaBlanc from Westland, became Public Act 62. The bill clarifies conditions under which a peace officer may stop and inspect a vessel.

The Michigan Boating Industries Association has long supported these changes as they allow boaters who have a "Safety Check Decal" displayed on their boat, to be free from random stops by marine patrol boats. "Safety Check Decals" are available to those who voluntarily participate in a U.S. Coast Guard Safety Check. Lake Associations and marinas can arrange for free inspection days with the Coast Guard or boater can arrange for a free inspection directly with the Coast Guard on their website: http://www.safetyseal.net/GetVSC/.

"This new law will help law enforcement and boaters," said MBIA President John Ropp.
"Because of the multi-jurisdictions involved on many of Michigan's waterways including Lake St. Clair, Lake Erie, the Detroit River and St. Clair River, it was not uncommon for the same boat to be stopped several times in one day. This is not an efficient use of time and energy and is a huge inconvenience to boaters."

The new law brings the procedures for stopping boats in-line with the reasonable cause procedures by which an automobile may be stopped. Under the new law, a peace officer may only stop and inspect a vessel which bears a "Safety Decal" upon a reasonable suspicion that the vessel or its operator is in violation of a marine law or is otherwise engaged in criminal activity.

The new law will be effective on November 1, 2012 and is expected to save funding for the boating safety budget. There are fiscal analysis available on the legislative website http://www.legislature.mi.gov/(S(v)c04e45p0tm 4b45bgeupb45))/mileg.aspx?page=home.

Ok America, we're getting FAT. This is not breaking news; in fact, we've seen it on the networks health shows, talk shows, etc. Most of the time it has to do with sugar in schools, cost of health care from obesity, or the effects on society as a whole. In fact, on last night's news, a small town spent over \$32,000 on special equipment for their rescue squad to upgrade the gurney to hold people weighing 1,200 lbs, complete with a winch. And stadiums are thinking of putting in some "wide" seats and charging 15% more as they take away other ticket sales. So what's this all got to do with boating. Your maximum number of passengers allowed on your boat has just changed. Yes, the plaque says how much weight you can carry, but if I put a weight scale next to my gangplank and ask the ladies to jump on so I can calculate my load, I'll be walking the gang plank myself. So I rely on the number of passengers on the card.

In the case of my older boat, the "average adult" used to calculate the number of passengers vs. weight was a wispy 140lb established in 1960. The water never came over the gunnels, but it was hard


to get the ol' Go Getter on plane. Now, the USCG has dictated manufactures to use a more modern weight of 185 lbs. Ok, 4 of you have to get off my boat!

And of course, that added weight is high on the decks, not in the bilge, so ballast and stability come into play (we learn that in TrueCourse Upgrade to Master class).

Think of all the ferry boats that are taking off seat (and selling less tickets) due to this change. The Baltimore water taxi service has downsized their passenger load from reduced it passenger capacity by 30%, and immediately ordered new boats. Wonder what Put in Bay famous water taxies are doing to control loads....no dogs to shore?

And let's not forget the loads of stuff we keep on the boat too. Clothes, food and beverage, ice, safety gear, books,....all that stuff that keeps coming aboard all summer. Maybe besides myself, I should also put the Go Getter on a diet. Saves fuel too!

FISHERMAN'S GUIDE TO SAILING

A new boating season is about to begin, helped along by a more peasant springtime this year than we've had in the recent past. Some are fortunate to live near a lakeshore community, while others travel quite a distance to be able to enjoy some time on the water.

Regardless of how you get to the water, you will be certain to encounter both power and sail boats sharing the lake on any given day.

While some fishermen are familiar with sailboats, most are not sailors, and the concept of tacking back and forth to travel upwind looks like random course changes for no good reason. Part of the hate/fear perception you hear about, is the apparent unpredictability of sailboats. It doesn't help that most sailors either talk sailing lingo (gibberish) or shout angrily at other boats. However, problems are eliminated virtually every time a sailor speaks to a fisherman as another sportsmen enjoying the water,

Sooner or later you might encounter a sail boat "race". Typically, these occur on

midweek evenings or weekend mornings. Most fishermen are fine with racing, but sail racing is unique in not having actual lanes or a track, so it looks totally chaotic and random. Since sailboats can't go directly in the direction the wind is coming from, they have to attack it in chunks. Sailboats can only move upwind by zig-zagging, first from one side, then the other. If a fisherman looks closely, he can tell when sailboats are in that zig-zag mode because their sails are pulled in very tight toward the center of the boat. Power-boaters who want to

impress a sailor can call that zig-zagging "tacking".



Racing sailboats usually have very fine control over their direction, so the sailors feel comfortable in coming quite close to other boats. A fisherman should not be alarmed if he is anchored with his line in the water. If a fisherman is trolling in the middle of a race and becomes surrounded by sailboats, the best move is to continue slowly in a straight line instead of trying to avoid everyone by constantly changing course. Sailors can compensate for a power-boat on a steady course better than one that is constantly changing course and/or speed.

Occasionally, fishermen might encounter a sailor yelling at them with rude insults and acting all hoity-toity and privileged. The best response is to just ignore them or give a pleasant wave and "I see you; don't worry." The laugh takes it from being a condescending order, to being a joke among peers.

The lake will soon be full of people in boats of all sizes and types, each looking forward to a good experience with their companions. There is no reason that all boaters can't do their part to promote the politics of good relations between power and sail.
