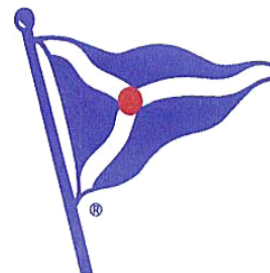

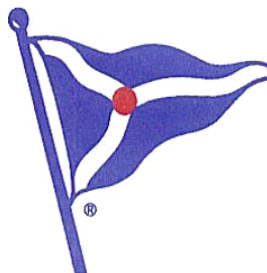
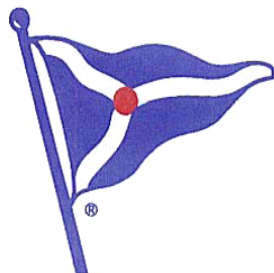

In 2005 I started attending the Greater Cleveland Boating Association meetings trying to get more involved. I started running through the officer chairs and became Commander of GCBA in 2010.

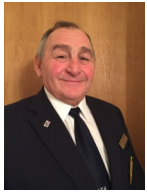
My wife and I are also members of Catawba West Harbor Yacht Club. We had originally joined in 2010-2011, and rejoined in 2015 and are still members today.

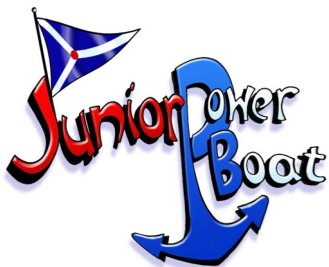
