Boating Associations of Ohio Report

ORC Proposed Amendments and Additions

Amendment to 1547.59 – changes the threshold for filing a collision report with ODNR from \$500 in damages to \$1,000 in damages.

Amendment to 1531.35 – Wildlife Boater Angler fund – deletes provision that not more than \$500,000 of the annual expenditure from the fund may be used to pay for equipment and personnel cost.

Transportation Budget

The Transportation budget process is well underway. The bill is House Bill 74. 2 years ago, the transportation drew many headlines for the debate regarding the gas tax increase. The Governor did not ask for gas tax increase this time around. However, he did propose a revenue enhancement by way of some fee increases. The Governor also included an enhanced distracted driving proposal that would have made it a primary offense and increased penalties.

The bill proposed to increase the annual Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) additional registration fee as follows:

- From \$11 to \$21 for passenger vehicles, noncommercial vehicles, and nonapportioned commercial buses, trailers, and semitrailers;
- From \$30 to \$40 for nonapportioned commercial cars.

Members of the House Finance Committee objected to the fee increases. When the substitute version of the bill was accepted, both the fee increases and the distracted drive proposal were removed. The House went on to pass the bill by a vote of 87-8. The bill is now being considered in the Ohio Senate. The Senate substitute bill also left out the Governor's fee increases and distracted driving proposal. The Transportation budget must be finalized by the end of March.



Trailer Legislation

2 bills have been introduced regarding trailers.

House Bill 96, sponsored by Representative Derek Merrin, would allow for noncommercial trailers to be permanently registered. The fee for this permanent registration would be:

- Eight times the annual registration tax for a noncommercial trailer (which is determined by the weight of the trailer);
- Eight times the annual \$11 Bureau of Motor Vehicles fee;
- Eight times the amount of any local motor vehicle taxes (if applicable); and
- The \$5 deputy registrar/BMV service fee.

House Bill 97, sponsored by Representatives Jon Cross and Phil Plummer, would replace the annual \$25 registration tax for commercial trailers and semitrailers with a one-time \$50 registration tax.

HB 96 and HB 97 are both pending in the House Transportation and Public Safety Committee.

Reintroduction of Use Tax Legislation

Unfortunately, HB 419, LEMTA supported legislation regarding the applicability of the use tax on out-of-state customers, was not passed before the end of the last General Assembly. We did get very close when the provisions of HB 419 were amended into another bill. However, that also failed to cross the finishline during the lame duck session. Representative DJ Swearingen is expected to reintroduce the legislation in 2021.

Abandoned Boat Change Updates

ODNR is working to approve an updated affidavit to reflect the new abandoned boat process for those vessels under \$10,000. However, if you would like to utilize this new process, you can initiate the new steps to take. You can request the title search through ODNR, send any notice to the owner/lienholders, and do your appraisal. ODNR should have that new affidavit approved by the Director soon for you to take to the title office. ODNR has indicated that the new affidavit will basically be a check list directly from the legislation to make sure all of these conditions apply:

- The vessel has been left without permission and without a valid storage or repair agreement for 20 days;
- The property owner has sent proper notice to the vessel owner and any lienholders. The notice must be sent by certified mail;
- The vessel continues to remain unclaimed for an additional ten days after notice was received; and
- The property owner executes an affidavit with the clerk of courts affirming the proper requirements have been met to take title.

Please reach out to others in your area to join our organization, as we need members so we can remain the viable, respected, and energized organization you want us to be.



By making the *Harbor Reports* open to all members, the GLCC is able to keep the reports accurate and up-to-date.




