As Spring moves forward the other great disappointment was the suspension of 2020 Traveler series through the month June. The Jr. Committee worked hard on planning for a 2020 season. As things were developing the committee had no choice but to suspend Traveler series through June. The Committee will look at what is going on and how our member clubs are dealing with regattas and then make a decision on to either suspend for the remainder of the season or try to have shorten Traveler series.

This led the committee, the bridge and the board of trustees to attempt to figure out if we could still safely hold the Jr. Bay Championship Regatta. After multiple meetings with everyone we came to another very very disappointing decision to suspend the Regatta until 2021. There were two major reasons for the decision. First was housing and how could we house the 135 participants safely. We put 4 participants to a room. It would have been impossible to maintain the social distancing that would need to happen. The other was preparation, with the Traveler Series being suspended and other Jr. Programs being cancelled there was no way the participants would be prepared and ready for a week long, multiple race regatta. Overall the Bridge, Board of Trustees and the Jr. Committee thought it was best to suspend the event until 2020.

Now onto some good news. As the State of Ohio begins to open loosens some restrictions it appears that we will be able to have our Sr. Sail Regatta and Power Boat Regatta along with Jr. Power. I am excited that 2020 will not be a total loss. The committees are hard at work and we are making plans as we move forward. We planning the regattas with flexibility in mind. As we all know these fluid times and things can change day to day. Please register for your respective regatta. We are not taking registration fees at this point. The Committees need to know how many plan on attending so we can be ready. Please register as soon as you can.

As with all of you, Pam and I never in a million years thought we would be in this position. We really appreciate all the support we are getting from our Bridge, our Past Commodores, and our Board of Trustees. I-LYA has some great people working hard through this unprecedented time.

COVID 19 AND I-LYA SR. SAIL AND POWER REGATTAS

In this unprecedented time and the fears surrounding COVID 19. Please be assured that I-LYA will do everything we can to make sure the 2020 Regattas are as safe as they can be for everyone involved.

As of May 20, 2020, the Governor of the State of Ohio, the Village of Put In Bay have opened the island and are allowing visitors to attend. Governor DeWine has also lifted the stay at home order, which allows residents in the State of Ohio to get out and about. Although the State and the Village is moving slowly in allowing more events and more people to assemble, I-LYA believes we will be able to move forward with our 2020 Regattas. The plan moving forward is to make these regattas safe. Here is what the committees are working on:

- * A larger tent to allow more room and social distancing
- * Multiple Hand Sanitizers placed throughout the tent and docks for use.
- * Mask will be made available if you want one and do not have one.
- * Non-latex gloves for volunteers who serve food and beverages
- * One-way entrance and exit into the tent
- * An organize traffic pattern through food and beverage lines
- * Each regatta will have one or more person appointed to ensure these protocols are observed.

Our committees have been working hard on making our 2020 regattas as normal as possible. I-LYA appreciates your cooperation to the changes that we must make to have a successful regatta.

Cruising the Great Lakes with COVID-19 and High Water

Before you take your boat out do you check the weather forecast, take a peak at the radar and scan the sky? Sure you do, but how about checking for COVID-9 closings? How about high water closings?

We might long for the days when we only worried that the Put-In-Bay docks and mooring field would be filled before we arrived, but the reality of this summer includes two new unwelcomed visitors. Some marinas, particularly those with fixed docks, are affected by high water and are either periodically or permanently closed. Many marinas have instituted special COVID-19 restrictions for permanent and transient boaters. When you consider taking a summer vacation on the water how can you know what to expect?

Since early May members of the Great Lakes Cruising Club have been collecting and collating up to date information on the status of selected marinas across all five Great Lakes. Pictured on the right is the very first compilation for Ohio's Lake Erie Marinas.

The first piece of data these GLCC volunteers collect answers the essential

answers the essential question "Is this marina open?" From there they ask if the fuel pier is open and if transient boaters are welcomed. Since this special project began these charts have been updated and expanded on a weekly basis.

Hopefully this timely information will be only a temporary supplement to the Great Lakes Cruising Club's outstand *Harbor Reports*. These *Harbor Reports* provide detailed information on over 1,200 harbors and anchorages through out the Great Lakes.



COLD WATER IMMERSION



Cold water immersion is almost always the result of a capsized or swamping of, or fall overboard from, a boat under 26 feet.

IT INCLUDES, OVER TIME, THREE DISTINCT PHASES:

In each phase, without a life jacket, a person faces a much higher risk of drowning.



Cold shock response
(gasping, hyperventilation)



Cold Incapacitation
(swim failure, loss of function)



Immersion hypothermia (eventually
resulting in loss of useful
consciousness)

WITH THAT IN MIND...WHEN BOATING IN COLD WATER:

1 Always wear a life jacket when in an open boat or on deck, **ESPECIALLY** if operating solo.

2 At least the operator, and **ESPECIALLY** solo operators, should carry emergency communication devices (e.g. hand held VHF radio, cell phone in waterproof bag) and signaling devices (emergency locator beacon and visual distress signals) **ON THEIR PERSON**.

3 Make sure the boat has a re-boarding device (such as a swim step, ladder or foot sling) that can be used by a person overboard.

4 Solo operators should **ALWAYS** attach an engine cut - off device when underway.

5 Cold water boaters should consider carrying a small inflatable dingy or life raft, and immersion (survival) suits.

6 File (and stick to) a float plan.


