



A special car will leave the Hotel Victory every race morning at 7:30 o'clock. It is necessary to catch this car if you wish to see the start of the races. 

There will be no entrance fees. The Directors of the Association have decided that it is not in accord with true Corinthianism to charge an entrance fee for any race held at the meet. Entrance will, therefore, be free to every yacht which complies with the rules of the Regatta Committee, and which is regularly enrolled in any club in the Association.

Race Notices.

ENTRIES for all races *must* be made with the Secretary-Treasurer at his headquarters at the yacht landing before 5 p. m. Monday, July 24.

MEASURERS' Certificates from home clubs MUST accompany each entry. This rule is imperative.

NUMBERS must be carried by each yacht on each side of its main sail. These racing numbers will be furnished by the committee.

ALTERATIONS of the race programme may be made at the discretion of the Regatta Committee.

YACHT RACING UNION rules will govern for all classes from the 25 ft. and larger. Inter Lake Yachting association rules will govern for all classes below the 25 ft. class.

Courses.

The Triangular Course for yachts in the 18 ft. class and over, will be from stake boat between the east end of Cibraltar and the west end of Middle Bass, to and around stake boat 4 nautical miles N. N. W., thence to and around stake boat 4 nautical miles S. W. 3-4 S., thence 4 nautical miles E. 1-2 S. to and across starting line between judges' boat and stake boat. In finishing, yachts must cross the starting line in the opposite direction from which they start. All stake boats must be passed to port.

A special course for the 16 ft class starting from the same point will be announced by the Regatta Committee.

The direction of the course to windward or leeward. and return will be placed on the bulletin board one hour previous to such race.

The distance for yachts of 21 ft. class and over will be 5 miles to the Leg. 16 ft class will sail over a special course to be announced by the Regatta Committee.

The course for the Free-for-All Hotel Victory Cup-Race will be announced by the Regatta Committee.

These prizes will consist of Marine clocks, compasses, side lights, anchor lights, folding anchors, launch whistles, etc.


Trophy prizes will be awarded in each class to the boat making the best average for the three races.






