SAILING RACES.

The sailing yachts will be divided into classes as follows:

Class A — Modern Cruisers. Class F — 21 Footers, restricted. Class II — 18 Footers, restricted. Class J — 16 Footers, restricted. Class L — 14 Footers. See rules. Class K — Cat Boats, restricted. Class R — Class R Yachts. Class Y — Yawl Class. Class T — Dory Class.

RACES.

There will be three races for sail yachts, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday, July 14th, 15th and 17th. All classes start each race.

8:30 a. m.—Warning Gun.
8:45 a. m.—Preparatory Gun.
8:55 a. m.—Starting Gun.
9:00 a. m.—Starting Gun for Class F.

The starting gun for each class will be the preparatory for the next.

TIME LIMIT FOR SAILING RACES.

Classes A, F and R-3½ hours. Classes H and J-3¾ hours. Classes L, T and K (short course) 2¼ hours.

SAILING COURSE.

The course for all races for sailing yachts in Classes A, D, F, H, J, Y, and R will be triangular, starting from a line between a stake off the east end of Gibralter and the Judges' boat off the west end of Middle Bass, to and around a stake three nautical miles N. N. W., thence to and around a stake three nautical miles S. W. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., thence three nautical miles E $\frac{1}{2}$ S and across starting line between Judges' boat and stake. In finishing yachts must cross the starting line in the opposite direction from which they start. All stakes must be passed to port, unless otherwise ordered by the Sail Boat Regatta Committee.

A special course for Classes L, T and K, starting from the same line, will be a shorter triangle with the same compass courses but with $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the side.

Sail Yachts will be designated as follows:

Class A—A1, A2, A3, etc. Class F—F1, F2, F3, etc. Class H—H1, H2, H3, etc. Class I—J1, J2, J3, etc. Class I—L1, L2, L3, etc. Class K—K1, K2, K3, etc. Class R—R1, R2, R3, etc. Class Y—Y1, Y2, Y3, etc. Class T—T1, T2, T3, etc.

SAIL YACHT NOTICES.

There will be no entrance fees.

Starting guns will be fired promptly at the time given in program.

Entries for all races must be made with the Sail Boat Regatta Committee at Headquarters before 6:00 P. M., Monday July 13th.

Measurers' certificates from home clubs must accompany each entry. This rule is imperative.

Alterations of the race programs or sailing course may be made at the discretion of the Sail Boat Regatta Committee. See Bulletin board.

Numbers must be carried by each yacht on each side of its mainsail. These racing numbers will be supplied by the Sail Boat Regatta Committee.

Judges' Boat will be the Steamer Grandon and will fly a white flag with blue letters thereon (R. C.). No person other than the Regatta Committee, Judges and clerks are to be allowed on Judges' boat, without the consent of the Sail Boat Regatta Committee.

There must be in all classes more yachts starting than prizes given.

POWER BOAT PROGRAM

Power Boat Races, I. L. Y. A., July 1914, at Put-in-Bay, O.

Class A Cruiser above 42 feet over all.

Class B Cruiser under 42 feet over all.

Class C Open boats under 12 miles per hour.

Class D Open boats between 12 and 18 miles per hour.

Class E Open boats between 18 and 25 miles per hour.

Races:-Tuesday July 14th and Thursday, July 16th at 2:30 P. M.

Course:—Two and one-half miles to a leg, starting outside of harbor and extending to a point opposite Ballast Island. Start must be made between flags (which will be white, marked with a "P" in black letter in center), then passing all flags to port and finishing between flags in opposite direction to start.

Entries for all Power Boat Races must be filed with the Committee before 11:00 A. M., Tuesday, July 14th.

2:35 P. M. start, Class B race ten miles. Twice around course. 1st prize \$40.00 and championship flag.

THURSDAY, JULY 16th-

All boats will be rated under the American Power Boat Association; rating rules adopted by said organization for the year 1914.

Measurements from Measurer of home club must be presented for entry, but the Regatta Committee reserves the right to re-measure.

Any protest must be made in writing within one hour after finish of race.

Captains are requested to consult bulletin board before the scheduled time for races.

RACING RULES.

All boats to be measured by the official measurer of their home club.

The Regatta Committee is to be furnished with the rating of each boat at the time of entry.

All boats in a class will start at the same time and handicaps allowed by allowing time in the corrected time. The boat making the course in the least corrected time shall be declared the winner.

All boats shall be measured under the general 1914 rules of the American Power Boat Association, and, that there may not be any misunderstanding by club measurers, the rating is to be found by using the following formula:

L. W. L.-Length of boat on water line when loaded for racing expressed in feet.

H. P.-Horse power when computed by following formula.

M. S.—Area of the midship section below water line expressed in square feet.

HORSE POWER.

A. x N. x S. x C.=H. P.


A .= The area of one piston in square inches.

N .= Number of cylinders.

S.=Stroke in feet.

C.=Constant which is 66 2-3% for a four cycle motor and one for a two cycle motor in classes A, B, C and D, and in class E the constant shall be one for a four cycle motor and one and five tenths (1.5) for a two cycle motor.





MIDSHIP SECTION.

To be expressed in square feet, and is to be obtained as follows:-

With the boat in the same trim as when being measured for load water line length, take the beam (B) of the boat at the water surface at a point 55% from the forward end of the load water line, or at such a point as may be designated by the owner or his representative to the measurer as that of the greatest immersed tranverse section. Divide B into five equal parts or stations, and at the first inboard station from either end measure perpendicular from the water surface down to the under side of the boat's planking (C). Then C multiplied by B will give the midship section.
