No entry fee will be charged in any event.

Sign your entry and state clearly all answers to questions.

Every yacht should be measured by the measurer of its home club and measurer's signature should be on entry blank.

All yachtsmen of the Inter-Lake and invited clubs, whether yacht owners or not, are invited and urged to participate in all of the events of the week and have their ladies participate wherever possible, to make the week successful in every way.

Get your entry in early to assist the Committees.

All schedules subject to change as necessary.

Obtain entry blanks, racing numbers and racing information at Headquarters.

Postponements, changes in courses or events, results and all official announcements will be on the Bulletin Board. Watch it.

Two or more entries must be received or an event will be cancelled.

Prizes in any event will be awarded according to number of entrants. If two entries, only one prize will be awarded; if three entries, two prizes, etc.

Ball Tickets, Banquet Tickets, etc., may be purchased at Headquarters.

The "Tobermory" will be the flagship of Commodore F. W. Wakefield. All yachtsmen and others attending the regatta are invited to visit the flagship at any time during the meet.

All events of the regatta will be started promptly on time. Be on your mark.

The official time used at meet will be Erie Yacht Club time, according to clock at Headquarters.

## Sail Yacht Program

### RULES

Certificate of measurement must be filed with entry. The Sail Yacht Regatta Committee reserves the right to order any Yacht entered remeasured.

Races for all Classes, starting five minutes apart on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday mornings; starting first class at 8:55 a. m.

All races under Y. R. U. and I. L. Y. A. Rules. See schedule. In Class Ck championship flag goes to skipper making highest percentage, cup to club having highest percentage.

Entries for all point races must be made with Sail Yacht Regatta Committee at headquarters before 6 p. m., Monday, July 12th.

Alterations of the race program or sailing course may be made at the discretion of the Sail Yacht Regatta Committee. Such changes will be posted on bulletin board.

Numbers must be carried by each yacht on each side of its mainsail. These numbers will be supplied by the Sail Yacht Regatta Committee at headquarters.

No person other than the Judges, Regatta Committee and Clerks will be allowed on Judge's boat without the consent of the Sail Yacht Regatta Committee.

All stakes are to be left to port unless changed by Regatta Committee. If the Regatta Committee decides to reverse the course and have stakes left to starboard, a blue flag with white letters R. C. thereon will be flown on the Committee boat.

Guns must not be fired from any yacht within one hour of the time of starting a race, and not until after every yacht has crossed the line.

All vessels following the races must keep to leeward, and at such a distance as not to interfere with the maneuvers of the competing yachts.

The races are open to every yacht which complies with the rules and which is regularly enrolled in any club in the Inter-Lake Yachting Association, Y. R. U., or which has been invited to participate in the races.

All boats sailing the long outside course will have four hours limit.

All boats sailing the short inside course will have three hours time limit.



## SAILING COURSES

The course for all series of races for Sail Yachts in classes P, Q, F, R, A and Y, will be triangular starting from a line between two flag buoys off Erie Harbor Light to and around a stake three nautical miles, N. E.,  $\frac{1}{4}$  N., thence to and around a stake three nautical miles W. by N.,  $\frac{1}{4}$  N., thence three nautical miles S. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., to and across starting line between starting stakes. In finishing the yachts must cross starting line and in the opposite direction from which they started. All stakes must be legat to port unless otherwise ordered by the Sail Yacht Regatta Committee as heretofore provided.

Course for Classes J, S, K, and Ck, will be a triangular course starting from a line between two flag buoys off Erie Yacht Club dock. To and around a stake  $1\frac{3}{4}$  miles N. E.,  $\frac{3}{4}$  E, thence to and around a stake one mile N. W.,  $\frac{3}{4}$  W., thence to and across starting line S. by W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W., making a total of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles. In finishing, the yachts must cross the starting line in the opposite direction from which they started.

### AMENDMENT to Y. R. U. RULES, "1915"

**SPINNAKER BOOM:** The spinnaker boom when in use may be swung at any angle desired, but must have its inboard end resting upon the mast.

### AMENDMENT to CLASS "F" RULES, "1916"

**POT LEAD:** Pot lead is prohibited in this class.

### AMENDMENT to CLASS "R" RULES, "1913" ¶

"Entries of all class R boats in I. L. Y. A. regattas will be accepted only upon compliance with the following regulations:

"1st. That quarter beam length as required by Rule 1 of the Yacht Racing Union be ascertained by actual measurement by a competent and technically trained man in yacht measurements.

"2nd. That displacement be determined by actually weighing all entering boats in this class in racing trim."

### RULES COVERING CLASS "Y" (Yawl Class)

Class "Y" will be handicapped under the following rule:

**RACING LENGTH:** Actual sail area shall be measured.

**AUXILIARIES:** Two per cent will be added to actual sailing time of yachts without engines as allowance to yachts with engines. Yachts with engine must have engine sealed.

**SPINNAKER:** The spinnaker boom in Class Y shall not exceed length of main boom, and shall be set from the mast.

All yachts in Class "Y" shall carry their full cruising equipment in all races.

**CLASS S—**Rules of the Long Island Sound Yachting Association to govern.

There will be a bulletin board at headquarters where changes in program and special instruction will be posted throughout the week.

All yachts whose preparatory gun has not been fired must keep clear of starting line. Any yacht violating this rule will be disqualified.

### TIME ALLOWANCE

Time allowance will be computed on yachts in Classes A and Y, under the formula and table of the Yacht Racing Union.

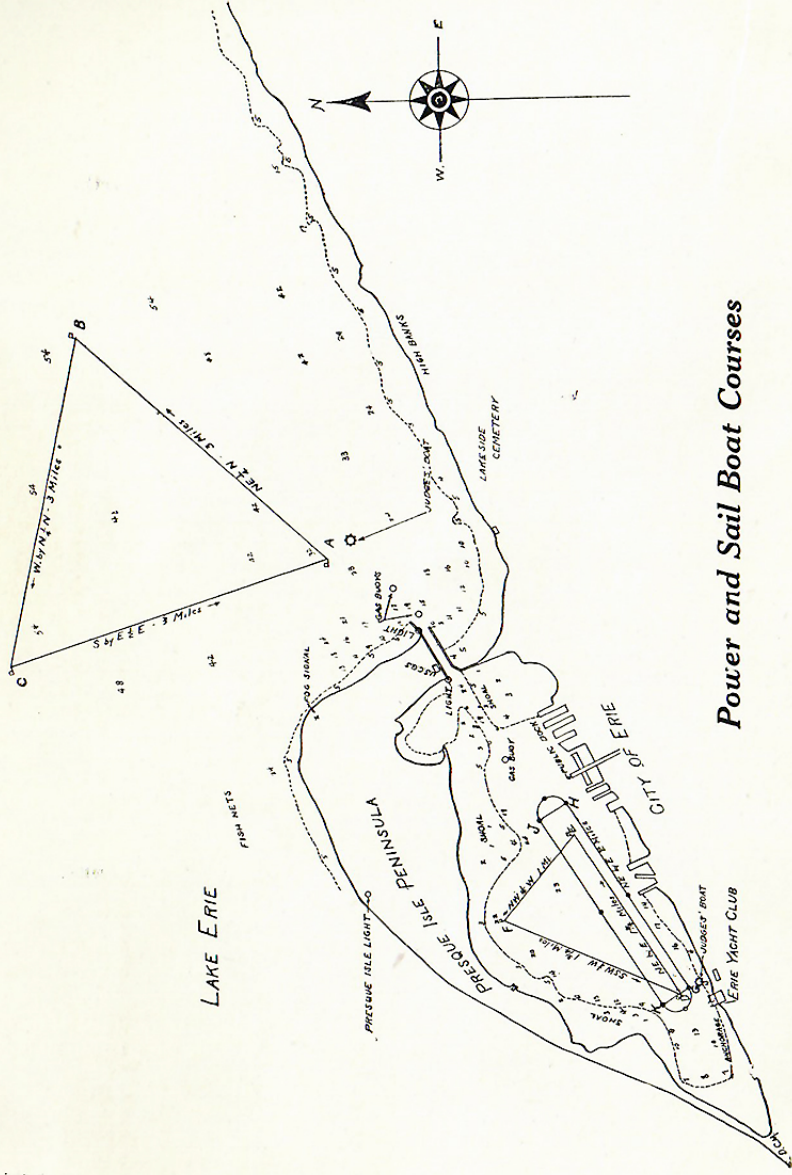

### Racing Rules

1. Championship series for each class shall consist of three heats and will be run under the 1920 racing rules of the International Power Boat Union.

2. Entries for all Power Boat Races must be filed before 3:00 P. M. Monday, July 12, 1920. No entrance fee will be charged.

3. Certificate of measurement to be filed with entry. Boats without rating certificate will be measured at the Regatta.

4. The first heat in classes A. B. C. E. F. and H. will be run under I. P. B. U. rating rules. Second and third heats will be run under a handicap determined by the Committee. All boats in above classes will start at the same time in the first heat, and handicap allowance made on corrected time.

5. The starting time for each boat in the second and third heats will be posted one hour before start of race.

6. Boats in Piston displacement and classes D. and T. will race without handicap.

7. All starts in Piston displacement and classes D. and T. will be flying starts. The boats will draw for positions prior to the first heat and will score on the pole boat. A white flag will be displayed five minutes before the start. Boats will take their positions behind the starting line and score down when a green flag is shown. The dropping of the green flag and firing of a gun will indicate start of race. In case of a false start a red flag will be shown as a recall and boats will resume their positions back of the starting line for a new start.

8. The boat making the greatest number of points in the three scheduled races for each class shall be declared the winner. Points to be awarded as follows: One point for starting and finishing; one point for every boat defeated, it being assumed for the purposes of this competition, that the number of starters are the same in each heat.

9. In case of tie for points, the race shall be run off.

10. Boats measured by the I. L. Y. A. measurer will be charged a fee of \$1.00 for open boats, and \$2.00 for cruisers.

## I. L. Y. A. Long Distance Race

JULY 11, 1920.

A long distance race, for cruisers, from Rocky River, Ohio to Erie, Pennsylvania. Held under International Power Boat Union rules.

Prizes totaling \$600.00 divided among the first ten boats finishing, in addition to a Trophy valued at \$200.00, and a Championship Flag for the winning boat.

Entries must be in the hands of the Chairman of the Power Boat Committee not later than 6:00 P. M., July 10, 1920.

Ratings must be filed with entries, but the Committee reserves the right to remeasure.

Starting time of each boat will be posted on the Cleveland Yacht Club bulletin board three hours before start of race.

The limit boat will be sent away at 8:00 P. M. from the Cleveland Yacht Club starting line. The finish will be at the Erie Yacht Club, Erie, Pennsylvania. A detail chart of Erie harbor showing the position of the finish line will be displayed on the bulletin board of the Cleveland Yacht Club.

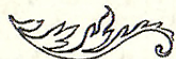
