Eastern Daylight Savings Time will be used for all events listed in this program.

All yachtsmen and their ladies are requested to register and present club membership cards.

Participation in races is limited to yachts entered and skippered by members of clubs belonging to the Inter-Lake Yachting Association, Yacht Racing Union of the Great Lakes, or other invited clubs.

Every skipper at the time of filing his entry should be prepared to present class registration or an acceptable measurement certificate for his yacht in addition to his personal club membership card. Measurement certificates should be secured from fleet or home club measurer.

Entry blanks may be obtained at headquarters. Early entries greatly assist the work of the committee. Please do your part. First registration Saturday, August 6th, Noon to 6:00 P.M.

An entry fee will be charged in all events as follows: \$3.00 for those sailing Course One, \$4.00 for those sailing Course One twice around and Course Two, and \$5.00 for those sailing Courses Three, Four and Five, power boat predicted log contest, \$5.00).

Watch the bulletin board for any change in sailing instructions. Results, official announcements and notices of protest hearings will be posted on the bulletin board. Watch it.

Guns must not be fired from any yacht other than official guns within one hour of the time of starting races and not until after every yacht has crossed the finish line or withdrawn.

All vessels following the races must keep to leeward, and at such distances as not to interfere with the maneuvers of the competing yachts.

A color gun will be fired at sunset.

Crew members available for races who do not have a berth may meet skippers who are looking for additional crew at the PIBYC where a bench and bulletin board has been provided for your conven-

The thought has been expressed to I-LYA officers that many yachtsmen who have never been in Put-In-Bay would like to attend the races during the Regatta, but fail to do so because they lack specific information. In an effort to get more new entries this year the following information has been compiled


- Put-In-Bay can be reached by driving on Ohio State Route No. 2 to Port Clinton, Ohio, which is located 39 miles east of Toledo and 75 miles west of Cleveland.
- Centerboard sailboats 20 feet or under, wishing to sail 12 miles to Put-In-Bay, may be launched at the Port Clinton Yacht Club, where launching hoist or drive-in launching facilities are available. Trailer parking and car parking space is available. These facilities are free of charge to all I-LYA members.
- 3. Those who do not wish to sail quite so far will find good launching facilities available, at nominal cost, at Catawba Point, which is approximately 7 miles east of Port Clinton. The sailing distance to Put-In-Bay from these launching sites varies from 3½ to 5 miles. Good car and trailer parking facilities are available.
- 4. Those who wish to ship their cars and boats to Put-In-Bay may do so on any of the fine Ferry Boats which run hourly from 7:00 A.M. to 7:00 P. M. from Catawba Point or several times daily from Port Clinton. These ferries can accommodate boats up to 22 ft. in length and mast may be left lashed on top of boat and trailer, being sure overall height is kept 6 ft. or under. A "back in" launching ramp is available at Put-In-Bay at no charge. It may be necessary to wade in the water during launching so be sure to bring bathing suit for this purpose. Launching hoist for centerboard boats available free at Put-In-Bay Yacht Club. Also, landing for dinghies. Launching hoist for keel boats available for a nominal fee at Ladd's Sales & Service on Doller's Dock.
- 5. Due to the unusual number of boats present at Put-In-Bay during Regatta Week, it is difficult to have a system set up for docking all boats so be sure to bring a good heavy mooring anchor and 60 ft. of anchor line. Most centerboard sailboats anchor with line to shore and stern anchor out. If you plan to anchor out in the Bay be sure to bring an anchor light.
- Reservations for hotel, motel, or other sleeping accommodations should be made in advance by contacting Put-In-Bay Tourist Information Center.







SAIL YACHT RACING INSTRUCTIONS

REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRIES

All yachts must file entries with the Sail Yacht Race Committee before 9:00 P.M. Sunday, August 4th, unless a competing yacht is unable to arrive at Put-In-Bay by this time.

Entries in the cruising classes must present measurement certificate in compliance with the Cruising Club of America Rule in effect for 1968, Converted racing yachts will not be accepted in the cruising classes.

Class Racing Yachts will be governed by, and must present at time of entry, measurement certificates in compliance with the rules of their respective associations. Current class rules as to crew, equipment and rigging, must be filed with the I-LYA Recording Secretary prior to July 15th.

The Sail Yacht Race Committee reserves the right to order any yacht entered to be re-measured.

RACING RULES

All races will be sailed under the current NAYRU racing rules, except as modified herein, and such additional rules or changes posted on the Headquarters Bulletin Board, which the Race Committee deems necessary for the successful conduct of the Racing Program.

At start and finish lines, time will be taken on the point of hull or permanent rigging that crosses the line first.

Number must be carried by each yachton spinnakers and on each side of its mainsail, and should also be on all overlapping sails.

Time allowance will be computed on all yachts in the time allowance classes, under the formula and rule of the NAYRU.

POSTPONEMENTS

Postponements of the starting time of a race will be for fifteenminute periods and will be indicated by code flag "P" (blue flag with white square). At the end of the first postponement period, code flag "P" will be lowered and numeral pennants "1" (white with red ball) will be raised and left flying, indicating that all starts will be delayed fifteen minutes. In the event that additional postponement periods are necessary, code flag "P" will again be hoisted. At the termination of the postponement period, code flag "P" will again be lowered and the numeral pennant correspondent to the number of fifteen-minute periods will be hoisted and left flying for the remainder of the starts.

CALLED OFF

In the event that the race for a class is to be called off, code flag "O" (yellow and red) will be hoisted on the committee boat two minutes before and shown until one minute after the starting gun or signal of the class concerned has been fired or made.

The classes following will take their time on gun or signal and make their starts on schedule.

COURSE FLAGS FOR ALL COURSES

Course #4 All markers to be left to starboard. Course #5 All markers to be left to port.

Courses 3, 2 and 1—Direction signal will be displayed immediately after Class C cruising boats have cleared the starting line.

SHORTEN COURSE

If it is considered necessary to shorten the course to be sailed by any class, code flag "S" (white flag with blue square) will be flown. Numerals displayed on the committee boat during this period will indicate the shortened course to be sailed.

SPECIAL NOTICE

In the event it is not possible to fire the starting gun for any class, due to conditions beyond the control of the committee, all yachts shall take their time from the signal shapes which will be hoisted on the committee boat.

SAILING COURSES

The start and finish line, for all courses is shown on page 43 of this program.

Course stakes will carry colored flags as follows: Course No. 1—Yellow; Course No. 2—Red; Course No. 3—Blue; Course No. 4 and 5—Orange.

All yachts, whose preparatory gun has not been fired, must keep clear of the starting line and must keep out of the restricted area. Any yacht willfully violating this rule may be disqualified.

COURSE NUMBER FOUR

Numeral four displayed on the "RC" boat from one minute after the preparatory signal until the starting signal for a class indicates that yachts of this class shall cross the starting line leaving the "RC" boat to their port; thence 4½ nautical miles 323° true to flag buoy which shall be left to starboard, this buoy being marked with an orange flag and placed about ½mile northwesterly from blue flag buoy of course No. 3; thence completing course to north of North Bass Island leaving the two flag buoys to starboard; thence across finish line between flag buoy and Lonz's Dock. It is advisable to avoid crossing the INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY since there may be anchored FISH NETS in this area.

COURSE NUMBER 5

Numeral five displayed on the "RC" boat from one minute after the preparatory signal until the starting signal for the class indicates that yachts of this class shall cross the starting line leaving the "RC" boat to their starboard; thence to flag buoy off west end of Green Island, leaving it to port; thence passing south of South Bass Island to Starve Island lighted buoy, leaving it to port; thence to flag buoy 2.3 nautical miles northeasterly of Ballast Island, leaving it to port; thence to finish line between flag buoy and Lonz's Dock.

If there are three or more yachts in the first race, a single yacht starting on the 2nd or 3rd day will make it a race.

Awards will be made on the basis of first, second and third if there are five or more boats in a class. A first place only for a minimum of three boats.

Sail Yacht Racing Instructions - (Continued)

GENERAL

No persons, other than judges, timers, starters, and clerks will be allowed on the Sail Yacht Race Committee Boat without the consent of the Race Committee.

Alterations of the race program or sailing courses may be made at the discretion of the Sail Yacht Race Committee and will be posted on the Headquarters Bulletin Board.

No guns will be fired for finishes until all classes have started.

Several short blasts on the whistle of a patrol boat or "RC" boat indicates you are being hailed. If you are near, or the only boat in the vicinity of a patrol boat, Stop.

Skippers who are short handed and desire additional crew are requested to inform headquarters and an attempt will be made to assist in locating experienced hands for you.

Available crew who are experienced and are unattached, should register at headquarters and we will attempt to secure a berth for you.

A yacht shall not employ any means of propulsion other than the natural action of the wind on the sails.

A yacht may anchor but not slip; nor shall way be checked by abnormal means.

Unless there is a specific class rule governing the numbers in a crew, N.A.R.Y.U. Rule 21A governs.

Races called off one day will be sailed the next day, if possible, as soon as feasible after the conclusion of the race for that class and at the time determined by the race committee.

PROTESTS

A protesting yacht must display a protest flag (code flag "B") or other suitable signal in the main rigging promptly after the infringement occurs or is first noticed and keep it flying until she finishes and the protest is acknowledged by the race committee. If this procedure is not followed protest will not be accepted.

All protests must be in accordance with NAYRU rules except that protests must be filed with the Sail Yacht Committee Registrar, who is located at the registration desks in the PIBYC clubhouse, within one hour after the protesting yacht finishes.

The Judges will meet each day during the series at 2 P.M. in Put-In-Bay Yacht Club to hear protests. Notices of protest hearings will be posted on the bulletin board. Skippers of all yachts racing are obliged to check the bulletin board before 3 P.M. following each race.

The Judges' Committee will make every effort to contact a protested skipper but if no telephone number or other means of locating him appears on his registration sheet, the hearing will proceed without his testimony and shall decide the protest as it thinks fit.

HISTORY OF THE SANDUSKY YACHT CLUB

Situated as we are in one of America's most ideal boating areas, it was only natural that boating and water sports came to Sandusky with its early settlers. Handbills and newspaper clippings still extant prove that there were pleasure craft races on Sandusky Bay in 1857, and probably much earlier than that.

Exactly when the Sandusky Yacht Club had its first beginnings is lost in history. We do know that it has been in existance continuously under its present name since April 13, 1894 when L. D. Anthony was Commodore; J. J. Gill, Vice-Commodore; F. A. Hubbard, Rear Commodore; Lane Lockwood, Secretary-Treasurer; Dr. William Gaylord, Fleet Surgeon; Rev. J. A. Maginnis, Chaplain; Charles R. Melville, George B. Barker, Charles Stroud formed the Regatta Committee and C. B. Lockwood was delegate to the Inter-Lake Yachting Association.

In 1899 the interest in yachting had assumed sufficient intensity to warrant a legal incorporation. A charter was obtained from the State of Ohio on February 21st of that year.

In the spring of 1900 the club purchased what is now the center portion of the Brown's Boats property, between Columbus Avenue and Wayne Street. It was decided to extend and improve the breakwater at the foot of Columbus Avenue and construct a two-story frame club house on the timber and stone crib at the end of the long pier. The club house was so situated that it effected an unobstructed view of nearly the entire bay. In the small basin so created, many of the members kept their boats. Many social events were held over a period of years, and the membership of the Club increased to about 200. Boats were constantly being added to the Sandusky Yacht Club fleet.

Just 30 years from the time the club was organized, or on June 28, 1924, "the tornado" struck along the waterfront and the entire club house disappeared as if by magic. No part of the building was ever found.

For a half dozen years following the Tornado, the club was homeless and inactive, although it kept its organization alive by meeting irregularly at various locations. Then, along about 1930, a determined effort was made to breathe new life into the Club. Makeshift quarters were rented in the former sail loft of an old boat yard at Battery Park. Money being scarce in those depression days, the members largely built the quarters with their own hands and such materials as they could scrounge here and there. Enthusiasm ran high, the membership grew, and the Club seemed well on its way to a new lease on life when a fire struck the club quarters and gutted them beyond repair.

HISTORY OF THE SANDUSKY YACHT CLUB (Con't)

Not to be daunted, the members immediately set up house-keeping on the second floor of a former marine garage on Speers' Island, and the Club continued its vigorous comeback. In the years 1934-1935 the erection of a new club house entered the "talk" stage. After scouring the entire waterfront for a suitable site, it was finally able to lease the land it now owns, and the center core of its present building was constructed in 1937 and 1938. The Club House was completed in January, 1939, although it had been used on several occasions during the construction period. The formal dedication party was held on May 13, 1939.

From then on, nothing could and nothing did stop the progress of the Club. In March of 1942, it purchased its land; in the spring of 1948, it sheet-piled its dock; and, from time to time, over the years, improvements and additions were made to the original structure until it became what it is today.

It is apparent that all this was the result of much planning and hard work on the part of many men, and over a long period of years. To mention any of them by name is to risk offending equally deserving men by omitting their names. Yet, certain names stand out with special luster along the seventy years of its existance, Commodores, L. D. Anthony, C. B. Lockwood, W. R. Huntington, Sidney Frohman, L. R. Mylander, Lee B. Keller, C. A. Shimansky, Earl V. Seitz, Fred E. Wiehn and Wilbert G. Schwer — just to mention a few of the more obvious. The Club has furnished nine of the Commodores and one of the Secretaries of the Inter-Lake Yachting Association, in which organization it has always been prominent.

The Sandusky Yacht Club is the headquarters of the Sandusky Power Squadron, and, during the late World War, it was headquarters for the local units of the Coast Guard Auxiliary and Temporary Reserve. It serves on many an occasion as a sort of civic center, and many yachts from other ports enjoy its hospitality during the boating season.

The Club is located just a block west of Battery Park. It is more than just an attractive colonial-type structure. It has a beautiful, large assembly room for meetings and dances; a tap room for those who want to socialize in something more than scenery, lounge rooms and, well-kept grounds around which the members and guests can berth their boats.

The "floating population" is an attractive asset to any waterway, and many cities view with envy Sandusky's beautiful, natural, land-locked harbor. The boats — rowboats, sailboats, motorboats, yachts — are picturesque against the natural scenic backdrop of Sandusky Bay.

The Club members don't "lay up" anything but their boats in the winter time. The Club is the scene of activity for twelve months out of a year — you'll find them there knitting (their brows), spinning (their yarns), mending (their friendships), patching (new acquaintances), darning (whatever), needle-pointing (compass, of course), and bending (biceps Brachii cum Spiritis). The membership is over 500. The Club is free of indebtedness and has substantial cash reserves. The membership is active, and now that they have the place they've wanted so long, things just keep going and going.

SEVENTY-FIVE REGATTAS AGO

Inter-Lake Yachting Association celebrates its 75th official regatta this year. Organized January 17th 1884 through the efforts of George W. Gardner who founded Cleveland Yacht Club seven years earlier, I-LYA existed on a loosely knit basis until the panic of 1893 almost wiped it out.

In a determined effort to keep it alive, Gardner, who had served as commodore for the entire period, reorganized the association. An active and dedicated board of directors was elected. Gardner was retained as commodore for 1894.

John E. Gunckel of Toledo's Ohio Yacht Club became vice commodore and Harry C. Kendall of Detroit, rear commodore. Ernest W. Radder of Cleveland Yacht Club, the man who was to spearhead the drive to create the North American Yacht Racing Union in 1896, was secretary-treasurer.

I-LYA's membership during 1894 consisted of Buffalo Yacht Club, Citizens' Yachting Association of Detroit, Cleveland Yacht Club, Erie Yacht Club, Ohio Yacht Club, Put-in-Bay Yacht Club, Toledo Yacht Club and the West End Yacht Club of Detroit.

Dates of the 1894 regatta were Aug. 8-10. Feature event was the race for the World Cup, placed into competition by the Cleveland newspaper of the same name. There were 15 starters in the handicap section. The winner was Chinook of Sandusky. Naphtha launch races were on the race circular and the winner was "Restless" with its six horsepower engine.

Sail yachts were rated under a handicap rule that provided, "The gross measurement of boats shall be determined by adding together the waterline length, the beam and depth of hull at the mast." The time allowance was two seconds for each foot difference in measurement per mile.

Two guns were fired — a starting gun and a handicap gun, with five minutes in between. Boats were timed as they crossed the starting line during the five minute period. Gun time was used as the start for any that failed to get away by the second gun.

Boat of the year was Sultana, a steel cutter owned by Commodore E. D. Potter, Jr., of Toledo. She was built for the specific purpose of beating the Cleveland-based cutter Neva.

I-LYA FIFTY YEARS AGO

William R. Huntington of Sandusky Yacht Club was commodore during 1918. He had previously held the post in 1901 and 1912. R. George Marsh of Grosse Pointe Yacht Club was vice commodore and Fred W. Wakefield of Vermilion Boat Club rear commodore. W. J. Billingslea of Maumee River Yacht Club was secretary-treasurer. Regatta headquarters were at Fox's Dock. The flagship was Huntington's yacht, Thelma, which had served as Dr. Lee DeForest's radio transmitting vessel during 1907 when the world's first radio broadcast of a sports event was made covering the I-LYA regatta at Put-in-Bay.

In addition to the traditional sail and power boat races there were Naval Reserve maneuvers, band concerts, hydroplane events, swimming and diving contests. The annual banquet and cabaret were held at Hotel Crescent, the ball at Hotel Victory and the trophy distribution at the Colonial.

Commodore Huntington personally paid for dinner and entertainment at spring and fall meetings and the regatta. Charles D. Lynch of Detroit was chairman of the board of governors of the Yachtsmen's Fund.

I-LYA TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO

Milton N. Gallup was commodore of I-LYA during its golden anniversary year. Harry Kendall of Detroit was secretary-treasurer. Regatta dates were Aug. 8-10, the same as in 1894. Commodore Stanley Puddiford of Crescent Sail Yacht Club was chairman of the sail race committee.

Shore sports included ball games, badminton, volley ball and bowling. While the men raced, the ladies enjoyed bingo and tea. The commodore's reception was held aboard the Mystic Isle.

RATINGS

All certificate of measurement or certification of rating on formal entry must accompany each yacht's entry and must be signed by the official measurer of its own club, association or the measurer of the I-LYA. The Cruising Classes sailing in the Cleveland, Detroit and Toledo races will under the Cruising Club of America 1963 Rule. The NAYRU no longer sponsors a "Universal" rule, therefore the Racing classes for each port may choose to use either the CCA or the Universal rule for their handicap race rating. The local Chairman will be responsible for the decision to which rating rule will be used for the Racing fleet under his jurisdiction. Where MORC classes are involved MORC measurement certificates must be used.

Contestants may be penalized for infraction of Racing rules by additions to his elapsed time in lieu of disqualification.

ENTRIES

All entries should be received by the local chairman of the Race Committee by as follows: Sandusky and Vermilion entries may be made up to race time. Cleveland entries by 9:00 p.m. Aug. 1. Detroit entries by 9:00 a.m. Aug. 4. All entries must upon arriving at Put-in-Bay register with I-LYA and pay entry fee for Regatta.

FINISH LINE

The finish line shall be a line approximately 150 yards long extending from Lonz's small boat dock on the southeast side of Middle Bass Island to a Flag Buoy on a line of 151 degrees (approximately). Buoy marked with white flag having black ball center and at night a quick flashing white light. Committee's position on dock will be marked by a R.C. flag by day and a quick flashing green light at night. Each yacht must identify itself to the satisfaction of the Race Committee on dock at time of finishing.

A yacht dropping out of a race should notify the Coast Guard, or Race Committee at Put-in-Bay Yacht Club, as soon as possible, preventing needless searching operation.

EQUIPMENT

Each yacht must carry suitable cruising equipment, including charts and navigating equipment, two suitable anchors and cables, coston signals, lead line, fog horn, suitable radar reflector and other equipment ordinarily carried on a cruise. One life preserver for each person on board, and at least two shall be on deck ready for use, one of which shall be equipped with a self-lighting device which will light when thrown overboard.

It is recommended that this life preserver also be equipped with a floating flag marker.

The Committee reserves the right to reject the entry of any yacht which they consider unseaworthy or otherwise unfit to make the trip or one on which the equipment does not meet the above specifications. ALL YACHTS MUST COMPLY WITH GOVERNMENT REGULATIONS COVERING RUNNING LIGHTS.

The Coast Guard has recommended that a white masthead light be displayed during the hours of darkness and/or fog.

SAILS

Sails must conform to NAYRU rules on racing trim and their own class rules. Cruising class yacht's spinnakers shall be limited to a maximum girth of 1.80 of the base "J" of the yacht's forward triangle.

CREWS

No restrictions are placed on crews except the skipper must be a Corinthian yachtsman and a member in good standing of a recognized yacht club.


RACING NUMBERS

Racing numbers must be carried on main sails and spinnakers for purpose of identification and recorded on the entry blanks in the space provided. If marked sails are not being used, a readily legible card must be displayed for identification.

JUNIOR RACE WEEK-1968

For the thirteenth consecutive year the Junior Sailors will have a Race Week of their own. These races are the quarter finals of the Sears Trophy Race. They will sail in Thistles at Put-In-Bay starting Monday, July 29, and continue through Friday, August 2, 1968.

All contestants must report to the Put-In-Bay Yacht Club before 4:00 P.M., E.D.S.T., Monday, July 29 for registration and Housing Assignments. Elimination races will start Tuesday, July 30th, at 8:00 A.M.

One of the rules of the North American Yacht Racing Union is that this championship be open to Juniors whos'e parents are members of a recognized yacht club belonging to the Inter-Lake Yachting Association. All contestants — must be at least 13 years of age by August 1, 1968. All members of the crew must belong to the same yacht club and must be prepared in the event they win to attend the North American Junior Championship-Sears Cup Races.

HOUSING

Male crews and chaperones will be housed at the Rendezvous Hotel. The evening meal will be at the discretion of the chaperone wherever they may choose to eat. The cost of the evening meal must be paid for by the contestants or the chaperone. Most of the committee will also be housed in this area and it is our hope to avoid any delay in handling our race schedule. All girl crew members will be housed in separate quarters from the boys. No Junior Sailor is permitted to have or drive an automobile on the island during race week. All contestants are to furnish their own wash cloths and towels.

ENTRY

Your Club must send in an entry by no later than July 15th, along with a check for \$50.00 for the team. In addition to this entry fee, there should be \$28.00 for each crew member to partially cover the cost of meals and housing. The expense of the winning crew of this Race Week will be partially paid by I-LYA for participation in the finals or Sears Cup races. The Semi-finals will be held at the Chicago Yacht Club and sponsored by the Lake Michigan Yacht Racing Association. Races will be sailed in Luder's 16' during August 12, 13, and 14th. The finals will be held at Saint Francis Yacht Club at San Anselmo, California. The Races will be sailed in Rhodes 19' during August 26 through 29th.

All entries must be sent to Mr. Charles Crawley, 9166 Jordon Drive, Mentor, Ohio 44060. Entries must be in by July 15, 1968. In the event that you have not determined the crew by July 15th, a letter of intent with your check will be sufficient.

CREWS

A team made up of four Juniors is encouraged; however, the actual races will be sailed with skipper and two crewmen in each boat. At the time of registration on Monday, July 29th, the skipper, who will be the helmsman during the entire series of races sailed, must be designated. A team of four members would therefore have an alternate designated who would be able to sail a Crewman during any of the elimination series.

RACES

We are expecting that we will have a minimum of twenty crews to participate. The series will consist of a minimum of 5 races with a maximum of 7 races. In the event the weather is unfavorable, the Race committee may terminate the series and designate the winner on the basis of crew standings at the time. All races will be terminated by 5:00 P.M., August 1st, and prizes will be awarded at the Trophy Dinner to be held in the Colonial Ballroom that evening.

BOATS

Contestants will be required to secure their own Thistles. It is expected that boats will be available for charter or lease agreements for those Yacht Clubs who do not have boats available locally. I-LYA will insure all boats. Thistles are made of fibre glass, are 17 feet long, with a beam of 6 feet. They are of the centerboard design with a hinged rudder. The sail area is 175 square feet, and a spinaker is carried. Each crew should secure the best possible boat as they alone will sail it. There will be no changing of boats between races. Each crew will be responsible to the owner for the care of the Thistle they bring with them to the series.

Each contestant will bring with him a Coast Guard approved life jacket and will keep it aboard at all times while sailing or racing. Each boat must have an anchor and anchor rope, bailer and two 75-foot lengths of line for fore and aft tie-up in mooring area, also a protest flag. Check all sheets and halliards carefully, for supplies for sailboats are very limited at Put-In-Bay.

IN GENERAL

A responsible adult must, at his own expense, accompany the crew and remain for the duration. Reservations for parents or friends can be made by writing to Chamber of Commerce, Put-In-Bay, Ohio. These reservations are limited, so don't delay.

Since supplies must be purchased and a commitment made to Hotel Rendezvous, no part of the entry fee is refundable. The deadline of July 15th is definite, as the hotel will plan on the number registered as of that date.

A program of entertainment is planned for every contestant at all times. There will be at least one dress-up affair where proper clothing for a dance should be worn.


Sport coats and slacks for boys would be in order. All contestants must stay together as a group. There will be a strict curfew and the accompanying adult will be responsible to see that his crew is checked in, stays in, and at all times conduct themselves as ladies and gentlemen.

Infractions of the rules can be cause for disqualification by Committee action.

The event of last year proved to be a huge success in the opinion of the contestants and everyone concerned. Every effort has been made by the committee to make this Junior Race Week even bigger and better. The I-LYA has pledged their entire support and a group of some 30 committee people have been hard at work to provide a great program.







RULES

This contest will be conducted under the American Power Boat Association's "Predicted-Log Power Cruiser Contest Rules," except for authorized exceptions and modifications for Western Lake Erie Cruiser Association. Each contestant will be sent a copy of the Rules and Instructions. References below are to the "Predicted-Log Power Cruiser Contest Rules."

ELIGIBILITY

The contest is open to any power boat owner who is an accredited member of a yacht club affiliated with the I-LYA. This contest is open to power cruisers, either inboard or outboard, 19 feet in length or over and as otherwise defined in Rules. Each power cruiser entered in the contest must be the bonafide property of or under charter to the person in whose name she is entered. Those who wish to score in the National Stone and Mikkelsen Trophy Contest must, in addition to the above, be individual members of the American Power Boat Association.

CREW

Competing boats must be navigated and steered by amateurs only. No paid hands shall handle the competing cruiser during the contest.

OFFICIAL OBSERVERS

Official observers will be assigned to competing cruisers by the contest committee in order of receipt of entry. The observer is an official representative of the contest committee and the competing cruisers official starter. The observer is a guest of the skipper. Each contestant is required to bring an observer along who will, during the contest, participate on a different boat.

SKIPPER'S AND NAVIGATOR'S MEETING

All skippers and representative and Observers must attend the Skipper's and navigator's meeting at the PIBYC August 4th at 8:00 A.M. E.D.S.T. There will be a briefing on Contest conditions and Predicted Log Rules. Rules and instructions announced at this meeting will be official and become part of these Contest conditions. Each Skipper shall provide a competent observer pool.

OFFICIAL FINISH TIME

Scheduled finish time is approximately 2:00 E.D.S.T.

ENTRY FEE

Each Entry Blank must be accompanied by a check for \$5.00 to cover the Entry Fee.

SCORING AND DETERMINATION OF WINNERS

Immediately on finishing the Observer will complete and close the Log. The Skipper or delegate will check the official Log and sign. The Observer must deliver to the Contest Committee immediately after finishing the contest, the signed copy of the completed Log. They will check the official logs of all competing cruisers to determine the winners in accordance with log sheet instructions. The competing cruiser having the lowest "Percentage Error" will be declared the winner of the contest; the next lowest "Percentage Error" second place, etc.

PRIZES

First prize will be the Alton H. Greeley Perpetual Trophy to be held by the Yacht Club of the winning contestant for one year. Flags and Trophies will be awarded to the First, Second and Third place individual winners, and a suitable Club Team Trophy will be awarded.


