I-L.Y.A. Man of the Year 1980

Ernest B. Hanmer is a sailor's sailor. His love of wind on sail and his knowledge of seamanship has earned him recognition on an International basis. His service to yachting as a juror reflects an ability to interpret racing rules in a manner that characterizes the highest of standards of sportsmanship.

His first interest in sailboats came in 1941 with a ten foot Biloxi Dinghy, which he sailed and raced at Bay Yacht Club, Bay Village, Ohio. Moving four years later to Cleveland Yachting Club he took command of a Comet Class sailboat and a year later started his "love affair" with

No. 542, a 1928 Star was his first, followed by eleven more, his present pride and joy, being his twelfth, is No. 6542 launched in May of this year. He has competed in two World's Star Championships - 1964 and 1976. Sixteen North American Star Championships show on his log. 1962 found him supplementing his Star racing with being a member of the afterguard on CCA and IOR boats. Fifteen Port Huron to Mackinac races show on his record and in addition he has sailed five SORCs, one as skippernavigator.

He holds the coveted "N" of the United States Power Squadron and shares this knowledge by teaching classes in celestial navigation. 1969 found him as navigator aboard the "Flying Cloud" in her unsuccessful bid to challenge for the Canada's Cup.

Rules are the name of the game as well as mastery of wind and wave. C.Y.C. named him during the 1950s to their Protest Committee and for several years has served as its chairman, USYRU has certified him as a Senior Judge. The I-L.Y.A. Appeals Committee, which he chairs has an excellent record in decisions up-held.

During 1976 he chairmaned the Star Class North American Championships at CYC. 1979 found him a member of the International Jury for the Star World's Championship at Marstrand, Sweden. This year he will see action as Chairman of the International Race Committee and as President of the Jury for the 1980 Star World's at Rio de Janeiro. 1979 also found him heading up the Protest Committees for the Thistle, Highlander and Tartan-10 National Championships and as Chairman of the Race Committee for the Lightning Class North Americans.

The International Star Class Yacht Racing Association has made him its Executive Secretary.

Ernie's wife, Lois, passed away in 1977. She was an active sailor. Their two children are Amy, a student at Kent State University, and Louise, married and the mother of his brand new granddaughter, Lois.




ABOUT THE COVER

Dr. George L. Sackett, Jr. was elected the 87th Commodore of the Inter-Lake Yachting Association for the year 1980 at the annual Winter Meeting of December 8, 1979. Dr. Sackett has been a member of Mentor Harbor Yachting Club since 1952 and was Commodore in 1969. He has been a member of Put-in-Bay Yacht Club for twelve years and a member of the Cleveland Power Squadron, where he has attained the grade of J.N., since 1960. Commodore Sackett is a member of the Blue Gavel and, at present, is secretary of the Mentor Harbor branch. He is also a member of the Blue Coats of Lake Cty.

Dr. and Mrs. Sackett have been active in the junior programs at MHYC and were in charge of the I-L.Y.A. Junior Program for three years.

George and his wife, Debbie, are the owners of the cruiser "Paradox" on which they have done extensive cruising, including the North Channel. Officers for 1980 were elected with Terry Kohler of Lake Michigan Y.A. as President, Tom Pollick of Lake Superior Y.A. as President Elect and Don Falrchild of Detroit River Y.A. as Treasurer.

Y.R.U.G.L. Racing activity for 1980 will include:

- 1. Richardson Trophy held at the Duluth Keel Club hosted by the Lake Superior Y.A., with tentative dates of August 25-26-27 selected. This match racing series will use pairs of C & C-33's or 34's, I-3's and T-10's.
- 2. Cross Cup It was decided that it was difficult to do more than score the 3 boat teams in the Port Huron-Mackinac Race. Therefore, the short add-on series will be dropped. The 3 boat teams racing from each lake should be selected from IOR rated boats between 24.0 and 35.0 ratings. A party for Cross Cup skippers and crews is contemplated at Mackinac Island.

3. Barthels - This trophy was recently put back into competition and for the last two years, has been awarded to the Great Lakes winner of the N.A. 40 regatta. In 1980, the trophy will again be used for this purpose, but the Union voted a 3 year limit for awarding the trophy to any one class. It was decided that for 1981, a one-design offshore class, preferably one that could be trailered, be selected to permit representatives from each lake to either bring or charter their own boat so all member associations may compete. (All associations are not presently represented by the NA 40). Boats meeting the criteria of this concept include the J-24, PY 23, T-10 and others. Chairing the committee for drawing up plans for 1981, is Frank Shumway of Lake Ontario. Anyone who has suggestions for this new concept may direct their ideas to him through me.



A History of the Mentor Harbor Yachting Club

Mentor Harbor Yacht Club was originally incorporated in 1928 on property developed by the "Mentor Harbor Company" which had made a harbor out of the marsh land in the late 1920's. The club grew slowly during the depression and pre-war years and since the early 1940's progressive permanent improvements have developed the club's facilities to the present state.

At present the club has 400 members and a fleet of nearly 75 power boats and 175 salling yachts. While the power fleet includes boats of almost every description, the sailing fleet is largely accounted for by one-design classes, and large cruising and racing sailboats with auxiliary power. Representatives of the club have won high honors all over the Great Lakes and on the ocean as well-including some excellent performances on the Newport-to-Bermuda race and the S.O.R.C. series. The club regularly hosts national sailboat competitions sponsored by the United States Yacht Racing Union. A number of the power fleet are regular visitors to southern waters each year, returning northward with the approach of spring.

One of the most important activities of the Mentor Harbor Yachting Club has been the strong support given to the development of young sailors. The Crow's Nest Summer Camp emphasizing swimming, water safety and competitive sailing for children, ages nine to seventeen, has been a major club program since the mid-thirties. The club's participation in the Junior-Regatta at Put-in-Bay over the years has been indicative of Mentor's strong support for this program.

Two members of Mentor Harbor Yachting Club have served as Commodores of The Inter-Lake Yachting Association - Charles F. Stewart, 1950, and Dr. George L.

Sackett, Sr., 1972.

A third member now joins this duo with Dr. George L. Sackett, Jr. serving as Commodore this year. The present Commodore has the distinction of becoming one of three father and son combinations which both have so served I-L.Y.A. The others being the Wintons of CYC, 1917 and 1948, and the Wakefields of VBC, 1920 and 1931.

The Yachtsmen's Fund

The Yachtsmen's Fund is a Trust, managed by The Toledo Trust Company as Trustee, under the direction of the Board of Trustees of the Fund. Established in 1919, its purpose is to provide funds for the operation of each yearly administration of The Inter-Lake Yachting Association. Only the proceeds from the Fund are used for this purpose.

The funds advanced to each year's administration after

deducting expenses are repaid to the Yachtsmen's Fund from the proceeds of contributions to the Regatta Program and various activities that are put on each year by the Flag Officers and Committee Chairmen. Monies advanced from the Yachtsmen's Fund to the current administration and then returned to the Yachtsmen's Fund are invested by the trustees and the income used as outlined above.

The Youth Fund

The Youth Fund as stated in its Charter is for the promotion of yachting activities and various youth programs for sailing, and is the source of funds for the I-L.Y.A. Youth Week program that is a vital part of each year's Regatta. Besides the underwriting of the total cost of the Youth Week Program, the Youth Fund makes

awards to the winning skipper and his or her crew each year, such awards being made in the form of scholarships to the college or university of the winner's choice.

The 1979 winners were Mark Thompson, Karl Ludwig, and David Werley of Pymatuning Yacht Club.

Total Paid to Winners - \$4,300.00 Total held in Escrow - \$2,700.00

THE RAY "GUNNER" SMITH FUND Annual Scholarship Award

In 1966 Raymond "Gunner" Smith of the Vermilion Boat Club bequeathed to the Inter-Lake Yachting Association \$17,000.00 to be invested by its Trustees. The income from this fund is awarded yearly to a Vermilion High School graduate meeting high levels of scholarship and personal achievement.

Since the inception of this Fund \$10,200 has been paid

to twelve colleges and universities to aid a total of fourteen winners of the award. The 1979 winner was Peggy Rini who received \$950.00 toward her tuition to John Carroll University.

A plaque listing the recipients hangs in the I-L.Y.A. Room of the Great Lakes Historical Society, Vermilion, Ohio.

HOW THE FUND WORKS

The Inter-Lake Yachting Association is a 95 year old organization composed of boating clubs surrounding the Great Lakes area that promotes the sport and recreational pleasures of boating.

This entails liaison with state, provincial and national governmental bodies and presents a united front to support all of our aims.

Each year's administration, headed by the Commodore is responsible for holding a spring meeting, staging an annual regatta, organizing and holding a junior race week program for young sailors the week immediately prior to the regatta and in December holding a fall meeting which is the annual meeting.

Funds for these varied programs come from two sources. One is from the proceeds of year book ads, entry fees, yearly association dues, banquet tickets, etc. The other is from the Inter-Lake Yachtsmen's Fund, a separate entity within the framework of Inter-Lake, that accepts contributions from member clubs and individual members of the Fund. The Yachtsmen's Fund trustees, composed of nine persons, one of whom serves as president invests these contributions and manages the Fund. The income from this Fund helps support I-L.Y.A.'s yearly activities. The Yachtsmen's Fund assets totaled over \$121,000.00 as of December 31, 1978.

The Secretary-Treasurer of the Fund is responsible for soliciting contributions from clubs and individual members to the Fund.

Many clubs place on their annual dues statement to members the following:

Voluntary contribution to I-L.Y.A. Yachtsmen's Fund \$1.00

Individual club members can then include an additional dollar in their payment to the club and the club treasurer then forwards these collections to us once each year.

Some clubs, who receive special recognition in our year book, make a 100%, \$1.00 per member yearly contribution to the Yachtsmen's Fund, regardless of how many individual club members include their dollar contribution with their dues payment.

If each club would voluntarily place the above on their next annual dues statement, it would help us finance the operation of Inter-Lake.



Guns must not be fired from any yacht other than the official guns within one hour of the time of starting races and

not until after every yacht has crossed the finish line or withdrawn.

All vessels following the races must keep to leeward, and at such distances as not to interfere with the maneuvers of the competing yachts.

Crew members available for races who do not have a berth may meet skippers who are looking for additional crew at the P.I.B.Y.C. where a bench and bulletin board have been provided for your convenience.







RATINGS

Each entrant in cruising classes must present an IOR Mark III IIIA, or PHRF Rating Certificate.

MORC entries must present valid measurement certificate issued by MORC National. No person shall be a recipient of an award unless he is a member of MORC.

Pre-Registration Only! Entry Forms for all 1980 Deep Water Races must be in the hands of the Registrar of I-L.Y.A., Harlo McNally, 264 Vassar Avenue, Elyria, OH 44035, no later than July 28, 1980. There will be NO registration at the local level.

Fees and a valid 1980 Rating Certificate should

accompany entry.

Deep Water registration fees include paid up WEEKEND Dockage at the "Village Dock" or the west end of "Township Dock".

RACING RULES

The race shall be governed by the current Racing Rules of the International Yacht Racing Union as adopted by the United States Yacht Racing Union.

Contestants may be penalized for infractions of Racing Rules by additions to their elapsed times in lieu of disqualification.

EQUIPMENT

All deep water cruising yachts will comply with USYRU safety list as noted.

Class 3 Modification — is not requiring life rafts or battening ports over two sq. ft. area. All other requirements are required.

Class 4 — All requirements as listed.

MORC — will use A or B list as required by their home station.

FINISH LINE

The finish line will be between a flag pole flying RC flag on the high bank on South Bass Island directly south of Lonz's Tower and orange buoy 1000 feet from the shoreline . . . Another orange buoy will be moored 500 feet inshore from the outer buoy.

Races from Mentor, Cleveland, Vermilion and Sandusky will finish with outer finish buoy to Starboard. Detroit and Toledo will finish with outer buoy to Port. The inner buoy will only denote the length of the finish line. All yachts must finish between the two orange buoys. Note that times will be taken between the flagpole and the outer buoy. Each yacht must identify itself to the satisfaction of the Race Committee on shore at time of finishing. For night finishes both orange buoys will have a steady white light. Be positive that you are Identified at the finish line.

There are no time limits for any race or any class within a race. You must finish at finish line and be recorded or drop out. (Toledo Race exception).

A Yacht dropping out of a race should notify the Coast Guard or Race Committee at Put-in-Bay Yacht Club, as soon as possible, preventing needless searching operation. Phone numbers at Put-in-Bay are:

No restrictions are placed on crews except the skipper must be a Corinthian Yachtsman and a member in good standing of a recognized yacht club.

ENGINES

Engines must not be used after preparatory gun except for rescue work and then turned off immediately after rescue work is completed, propeller locked in gear with dead engine.

DIVISIONS

When a class has twenty or more participants at the discretion of the local chairman, the class will be divided into two or more divisions.

Suitable place flags and trophies to be given in accordance with the number of starters in a class. Place flags only for one-design classes. Awards will be presented at the Commodore's reception Monday afternoon.

Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions

ENTRY

All entries must be on official entry forms provided by the registrar. These forms will be available from all member yacht clubs or from the registrar, Harlow McNally, 264 Vassar Avenue, Elyria, Ohio 44035.

All registrations must be made in advance and must be postmarked no later than July 28, 1980. No registrations will be accepted at Put-in-Bay.

All handicap rated yachts must include a legible copy of a current valid (1980) rating certificate.

Each entrant in the IOR classes must present an IOR MARK III or III-A certificate.

IOR Yachts must meet current USYRA Category III Modified (less Group A - Item 4 and Group C - Item 2) MORC, Equipment List B.

No MORC registration will be accepted without a current valid (1980) MORC rating certificate issued by MORC international attached.

No MORC entrant shall be a recipient of an award unless he is a member in good standing of MORC.

Class racing yachts will be governed by current rules of their respective associations. Current class rules must be filed with the I-L.Y.A. Recording Secretary prior to July 15th.

Tartan-10 Class One-Design rules will govern. Category III applies, except the life raft requirement is waived.

MANAGEMENT AND RACING RULES

The races shall be governed by the current racing rules of the International Yacht Racing Union as adopted by the United States Yacht Racing Union. Except as modified by this program and by such additional rules or changes posted on the bulletin board.

Crew—except as otherwise provided in class rules, the total number of a crew will not be limited.

Sail Numbers— proper sail numbers and class designation, where required, must be carried on mainsails, spinnakers, and when required on headsails whose all overlapping LP measurement exceeds 130%. Time will not be taken if sails are not so numbered.

All yachts entered or racing shall be subject to the direction and controls of the Race Committee, but it shall be the sole responsibility of each yacht to decide whether or not to start or to continue to race.

The Sail Yacht Racing Committee has the authority to protest and the judges to disqualify a yacht for unsportsmanlike conduct.

RATINGS AND FLEET DIVISIONS

Preliminary scratch sheets and divisions will be posted on official bulletin boards Saturday evening at 6 P.M.

All questions and/or protests regarding ratings must be filed with the Race Committee at the P.I.B.Y.C. before 5 P.M. Sunday. No questions or protests regarding ratings will be accepted after this deadline. The final official scratch sheets will be distributed at the Skippers' Meeting on Sunday at 8:00 P.M. along with class color code flags and finish position cards.

COURSE DIRECTION

Course direction flags (red and green) will be flown from the port spreader of the "RC" boat one minute after previous start until starting signal of the next class (to allow for changing course directions for the later classes).

CRUISING COURSE NUMBER 4 (courses are true, miles are nautical 14.4 miles either direction. For rating purpose.)

If the numeral four is displayed in the "RC" boat from one minute after the warning signal until the starting signal, the yachts in this class shall cross the starting line in proper manner for marks to port or starboard per course direction flag. Marks of this course are: buoy RN2, buoy R6 and I-L.Y.A. mark. See course chart.

Short Course 4 Marks are: Red Nun RN2, Buoy B3 and

Buoy B1. See course chart.

THE RACE COMMITTEE SUGGESTS THAT YACHTS AVOID CROSSING THE INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY LINE - THERE MAY BE ANCHORED FISH NETS IN THIS AREA.

CRUSING COURSE NUMBER 5 (courses are true, miles are nautical 15.8 miles either direction. For rating purpose)

If the numeral five is displayed on the "RC" boat from one minute after the warning signal until the starting signal, the yachts in this class shall cross starting line in proper manner for marks to port or starboard per course direction flags. Marks of this course are I-L.Y.A. Flag at Green Island, Buoy R2, and I-L.Y.A. mark. See course chart.

Short Course 5 Marks are: I-L.Y.A. Flag at Green Island, Buoy R2, Black Can BC5 and Ballast Island. See course chart.

STARTING RESTRICTED AREAS

Each yacht must keep clear of the indicated restricted area and of the first leg of the course until after the five minute preparatory signal for its class. Any yacht violating these areas will be summarily disqualified.

Protection Markers - There will be flag markers approximately 50 feet from the Race Committee boat. No yacht may properly start between such markers and the Committee boat.

R.C. COLOR CODE

The R.C. Boat will fly large color code flags corresponding to the next class to start during the 5 minute preparatory period prior to start. Since postponements and delays in the published starting times are possible, it is imparative that yachts pay strict attention to these color code flags. Any yacht which disturbs the start of another class may be subject to disqualification by the R.C.

YACHT COLOR CODE

All yachts must fly the required color code class identification flags on their backstay at least 6 ft. above the deck.

RECALL

The Race Committee shall make every effort to recall those yachts which were over the starting line early by hailing their sail numbers and sounding one sound signal for each yacht over early. However, it shall be the sole responsibility of each yacht to start properly.

SIGNALS

In the event of the failure of mis-timing of a gun, yachts will take their time from the signal hoisted on the Race Committee boat. Time will not be given to contestants from the Committee boat.

SPECIAL SIGNALS

Will be displayed from Race Committee boat two minutes before the start of a class and will be accompanied by two guns or sound signals.

POSTPONEMENT

Code Answering Pendant (vertical red and white stripes) means: "All races not started are postponed." The sound signals will accompany the hoisting of the "AP". The AP will be lowered, accompanied by one sound signal, one minute before the next signal is made.

INTERRUPTED RACES

Code Flag "N" over First Substitute (Blue and White checkered over Blue and Yellow triangular) cancels race about to start ONLY. This signal will be lowered one minute before the starting signal of the next class, which will start as scheduled.

Code Flag "N" over "X" (Blue and White checkered over White with Blue cross) means all races except those in progress are off until later in the day. Signal will be lowered one minute before the Warning. Signal to be followed by Preparatory and Starting Signals at five minute intervals.

Code Flag "N" (checkered Blue and White) means all races, including those in progress, are off for the day.

Three sound signals will accompany the hoisting of any of the three signals above.

MARKER MISSING

Code Flag "M" (blue with diagonal white cross): "In the event that a marker is completely missing from its station, yachts will round the committee boat displaying "RC" flag, and "M" flag stationed in the approximate location of the missing marker".

SHORTENING COURSE - AFTER THE START

CODE FLAG "S" (white with blue square in center) will be displayed from a committee boat bearing "RC" flag and stationed near a rounding marker = "Instead of sailing the prescribed course, round the marker near the committee boat and head for the finish line".

PROTESTS: A yacht to protest MUST (MANDATORY)

Immediately, from the time of the alleged violation, display and keep flying in her rigging CODE FLAG "B" (solid red with swallow tail) or suitable make-shift flag.

Immediately inform the yacht to be protested, and at the finish line so inform the Race Committee (if practical on courses 4 and 5):

Submit written protest in accordance with IYRU/USYRU rules with the chairman of the Race Committee, or the Sail Yacht Registrar in the PIBYC clubhouse within one hour after finishing or retiring.

The Judges will meet each day during the series as soon

as they can do so beginning at 1:00 P.M. local time at the PIBYC clubhouse to hear protests. Notices of protests will be posted on the Club and downtown bulletin boards. It shall be the sole responsibility of each skipper involved in a protest, or his designated representative, to be present at the hearing, or the Judges, in his absence, will proceed with the hearing and make a determination as they deem fit.

FINISH LINE

The finish line will be between a flagpole flying an RC flag on the high bank on South Bass island directly south of Lonz's tower and an orange buoy 1000 feet from the shoreline... Another orange buoy will be moored 500 feet inshore from the outer buoy. This inner buoy will only denote the length of the finish line. (All yachts must finish between the two orange buoys.) Note that times will be taken between the flagpole and the outer buoy.

SCORING

The following low-point scoring system will be used to compute totals for trophies and awards:

| Fourth place | 4 points |

DNS and DNF will receive points totalling the number of entries in the class. DSQ will receive points totalling the number of entries in the class plus 1.

If there are three or more yachts in the first race, a single yacht starting on the second or third day will make it a race.

AWARDS

Five or more yachts in a class - first, second and third awards.

Four yachts in a class - first and second awards.

Three yachts - first place only.

In cases of numerical ties, the higher place will be awarded to the boat which beats the other the larger number of times, or by any other equitable means determined by the Judges' Committee.

Reflections on the IOR Rule After 10 Years

The current measurement rule for handicapping auxiliary yachts for sailboat racing is the "International Offshore Rule". The oft maligned IOR now attracts mainly the serious racer. The attraction of measurement rule is that no judgment by a handicapper is involved. A handicap rule suffers when dealing with only one yacht, or a small number of yachts of a similar design, since it rates not only the yacht, but also the quality of the crew and afterguard, the preparation and the sail inventory. Almost automatically, the superior sailor feels discriminated against, when extra penalty seconds are assessed by the handicapper for this extra effort. A measurement rule uses physical measurements, taken from the yacht's hull and rig. These measurements, which can be checked, re-checked and verified by other measurers, are then used with a complicated set of formulae to estimate a yacht's speed potential, which is expressed as the "sailing waterline length", or rating in feet or meters, of the yacht. Using this number, a set of time allowance tables and the length of the event (this length may be adjusted for point to point races, since the time allowance tables assume equal proportions of beating, reaching and running) a scratch sheet is compiled with which to calculate corrected elapsed times.

Critics of the rule point out that some yachts get unfair advantages by exploitation of features of the rule by their designers, while other Naval Architects ignore these possibilities in their designs. Some of the latter's designs

therefore are seriously disadvantaged.

The body which administers the rule is the International Yacht Racing Union, the IYRU, and its Offshore Racing Committee, the ORC. Advising the ORC is a group of internationally renowned Naval Architects who compose the International Technical Committee, the ITC. After a long stewardship of the ITC by Olin Stephens, the chairmanship of the committee now rests with American yacht designer Gary Mull. When problems arise, usually because a new "breakthrough" has been found by which a yacht's rating under the Rule is considerably lower than its speed potential, the ITC is charged with adjusting the rule so this advantage disappears. The ITC proposes changes, which then are handed up to the ORC for adoption or rejection. The ORC is composed of representatives from the various national authorities. For the United States, the authority is the USYRU and its Offshore Committee. Thus the channel through which US sailors can influence modifications of the IOR rule is through the Offshore Committee, the USYRU, and of course by direct input to members of the ITC. Remember, however, that the ORC of the IYRU has the final say-so, and that they often reject ITC proposals aimed at solving problems perceived in this country with the IOR rule.

The IOR rule was first adopted in 1969. Existing designs had been measured, and vertification done by comparing the known speed potentials of these yachts with their measured ratings. All was fine, until designers analyzed the mathematics of the Rule's formulae, and began experimenting with modifications of certain parameters. This was done both by actual designs and by computer simulation. As a result, a new generation of offshore yachts developed, which quickly outclassed existing designs in terms of rating versus speed potential. In all fairness, these were healthy, seaworthy yachts, with generous freeboard and large interior volume, when compared to designs fostered by previous rules, the CCA

(Cruising Club of America, which encouraged low freeboard, wide beam keel/centerboard hulls and large mainsails with substantial boom lengths) in the US and the RORC (Royal Ocean Racing Club, which encouraged somewhat narrow beam deep/keel boats with tumble-home of the topsides, which lacked the CCA's bouyancy and were very wet) in Europe.

Accusations soon were levied at the designers who had formulated the rule, who of course reaped a large list of orders for new designs. For a period of time, obsolescence of the majority of the fleet was a fact. Each year brought a new crop of designs that outclassed the previous year's winners. With the passage of time, plateaus in design development were reached, until previously unexplored possibilities were exploited. The most recent of these was the ability to capitalize on the AGS (after girth station) and lengthen the sailing length in boats that were very light weight. Australian Bruce Farr was among the leaders in this development. The ORC responded by penalizing yachts whose ratio of sail area to displacement exceeded a preset limit.

The central problem with the IOR rule is that too few measurement points are taken. Notwithstanding the time consuming measurement procedures now in effect, the measurements are so sparse as to permit designers to confuse the rule about the actual shape of the hull. Present measurements are taken at the bow, the stern and the mid-section. Intervening portions of the hull are ignored. This works well enough at the bow, where contortions of the lines lead to disastrously poor performance, but is inadequate at the stern, where water is already in turbulent flow, and contortions do not exact a prohibitive price in boat speed.

Acknowledging that older designs were made while designers were still in their learning curves, the ORC responded by allowing retrospective adjustments through modifications known as "IOR III A". Full influence of III A is for yachts designed 1972 and earlier, while a lesser adjustment is given yachts launched between 1972 and 1976. Still, some yachts fare better than others. Current efforts by the ITC are being directed towards further retrospective adjustments. The new set of adjustments will not be predicated on chronological age alone, since this still ignores the advantage enjoyed by yachts that were "ahead of their time" or the disadvantage of the yacht "behind its time". Instead, proposals currently being considered include taking more measurements than is the present requirement, and using this additional data to better estimate the true speed potential of the hull shape. Fortunately, these adjustments will only be made retrospectively, so that the ground-rules to which designers are now working are not changed. If a new measurement formulae were to be introduced, a new 10 year period of development would be required before stability would be reached.

The present status of the rule is far from satisfactory to many sailors. As alluded to earlier, there are many designs that are not fairly rated. Responding to widespread grassroots discontent, a handicapping system, based on past performance of classes of yachts, was implemented with general acceptance and satisfaction. It has been less costly than IOR measurement, has answered the needs of almost all club racers, and given a fair shake to yachts that were relegated to racing oblivion by the measurement rule. The Lake Erie Performance Handicap Racing Fleet,

PHRF, has been a welcome addition to the scene. Perfectly suited for short races, the fairly coarse handicapping increments (3 seconds per mile), cause some problems in long races. At the end of a 200 mile race, the difference in handicap for one rating increment amounts to 10 minutes, as opposed to 30 seconds for the measurement rule.

A new arrival on the scene was spawned on the East Coast, and is dubbed the Measurement Handicapping System (MHS). Complete hull lines are taken by a "magic wand", and entered into computer memory. Instead of calling the next step "formulae" for computation, they are now "algorithms" for the computer, and develop a "Speed Prediction Program". First trial in a major event was the 1978 Bermuda Race. Winner and runner up in the MHS division was a sentimental favorite, the Concordia Yawl. Although in a long point-to-point event such as the Bermuda luck and chance play a large role, these results imply that, just as before, the MHS will have its problem with boats that are rated too lightly or too heavily, and that a designer's learning curve can be anticipated.


Since changing the basics of any measurement rule lead to a period of development before stability is reached, it is important not to dump the present rule in favor of the unknown. New is not necessarily better, and may well solve old problems while creating new ones. The best hope seems to be in maintaining stability in the existing rule, while giving retrospective adjustments to yachts unjustly disadvantaged. This is the direction which

the ORC of the IYRU is taking.



Lake Erie Fact Sheet

When questioned as to which of the Great Lakes is smallest, most of us would quickly answer, of course, Lake Erie. But how clear is your perception of actual comparisons among the lakes? Depth, volume and water retention time all vary greatly from lake to lake. A look at these factors provides a different perspective to those whose only view of the Lake has been from its shores or from maps.



Lake Erie Is actually the fourth largest lake in surface area (9900 mi² compared to Lake Ontario, the smallest, 7340 mi²). Its depth, however, is dwarfed by every other lake, the maximum depth (212 feet) exists only in a small area of the Lake's eastern basin. The average depth is only 62 feet. Compare this to the average 480 feet for Lake Superior (the deepest) and 195 feet for Lake Huron (the fourth deepest).

Superior is more than twenty-five times as large as Lake Erie in terms of volume—2935 mi³ compared to 116 mi³. And the amount of time which water received as precipitation or inflow remains in the Lake (retention time) is drastically different as well—200 years for

Superior, three years for Lake Erie.

These factors considered together account for some unique aspects of concern regarding Lake Erie. The small volume intensifies water quality problems since there is less capacity to assimilate pollutants from shoreline and tributary discharges. On the other hand, the short retention time allows more rapid cleansing of these effluents once pollution abatement controls are enforced.

Weatherwise, the Lake's shallowness affects both storm build-up and ice formation. The shallow depth, combined with other factors, allows waves to form quickly and with little warning, causing problems for recreational boaters, shippers and shoreline residents. In the winter, Lake Erie develops the most extensive ice cover of all the lakes; its shallow depth makes it more responsive to changing air temperatures. A normal winter can bring 95 to 100 percent ice cover.



IOR 1980

- 1. The IOR rule as currently modified by the National Authority (USYRU), is ADOPTED with the following extension . .
- 1.1. There will be no limitation on the number of sails.
- Lake Erle IOR revalidation.

Revalidation for yachts with lapsed IOR certificates, started in 1979, will be continued. This is done to accommodate the club racer and simplify the work of local race committees. Revalidation via official channels through USYRU has been simplified and is encouraged. The previous requirement for remeasurement afloat after transfer of ownership has been waived. It is not the intent to revalidate certificates that have been superceded by new measurements, if these new measurements resulted in higher ratings than those of the old certificate. It is the responsibility of the owner applying for local revalidation to assure that there have been no alterations to rig, ballast, sails or controlled measurements, and that the most recent certificate is submitted. 

PHRF-LE Class Rules - 1980

I. CLASS REQUIREMENTS: PHRF Class Requirements are primarily intended to limit interclub racing to "Cruising/Racing" auxiliary sail yachts, and not to establish equipment or construction standards. Adequate equipment and crew for conditions to be encountered is inescapably the responsibility of the skipper or master on a yacht.

"Yachts shall be cruising type, single hulled, selfrighting, fit for sea, and shall have self-bailing cockpits, an enclosed cabin with at least two bunks, operable galley,

head (or fitting bucket)."

"Yachts shall have adequate lifelines, a minimum crew of three, and shall be capable of reducing sail under

adverse conditions."

"Yachts shall have an operable auxiliary engine. Outboard engines may be stowed below or carried on a lifting or tilting bracket at the discretion of the skipper."

II. HANDICAP CLASSIFICATIONS:

"P" - For a class to be granted permanent status it is required that there are at least 75 race points in the computer files for that class and that there be at least 3 members of the class with five or more finishes in the computer file during the previous twelve months. A handicap in this category would only be changed during the off season review period, and would not be modified during the period from May 1 to October 31.

" - A regular rating is indicated in the printed listings by a blank. This class of handicap could be changed by the handicap committee at any one of its regular meetings with the change to go into effect 7 days after the date of the meeting. Special efforts will be made to assure timely

notification of changes in regular handicaps.

"R" - Restricted handicaps will be issued to all yachts which do not meet the minimum equipment requirements

specified for a normal PHRF class member. In addition, any yachts which because of extreme design parameters, either on the light displacement side or on the heavy displacement side, which the handicapping committee considers impossible to handicap fairly, will be issued a restricted rating. (Beginning in 1981 yachts without measurement validation will be issued "R" handicaps). Yachts with restricted ratings will be issued special handicap cards which state that the handicap is not valid for any invitational race and race sponsors will be informed that it is strictly against class rules to allow a "R" handicap yacht to compete in the regular PHRF Division. These yachts will be encouraged to compete in club competition and in special classes, such as JAM or "racing division" classes at invitational events.

III. SAIL AND RIG LIMITATIONS: Most sail restrictions which apply to IOR rated boats also apply to PHRF. This includes present limitations on special sails as well as restrictions concerning legal methods of trimming sails. There is no restriction on the number of sails for PHRF races. Free flying sails such as bloopers or staysails are Jibs and must be measured as such. The L.P. of a blooper must not exceed the rated L.P. for the yacht.

Rig restrictions concerning materials, plan, tuning, and use applicable to IOR yachts also apply to PHRF yachts, except that there is no restriction on the installation or use

of forestay hydraulics.

IV. MODIFIED RIGS: The following system is used for adjusting handicaps to account for modifications of standard rigs where no change has been made to hull shape or ballast. Standard rig is considered to be foretriangle and mainsail dimensions no greater than originally specified by the designer, and L.P. no greater than 1.55 times the base of the foretriangle.

The spinnaker dimension limits are essentially those of IOR. Any spinnaker which is no-penalty under IOR or MORC shall not incur penalty under PHRF. For oversize spinnakers the excess in girth will be used to calculate a spinnaker pole penalty. If the length is oversize, a 6 second penalty will be assessed.







Lake Erie Offshore Championship 1979: Epilogue

Witchdoctor, a C&C 38 co-skippered by Don Bartels and Bill Kubicek, was the 1979 Lake Erie "Boat of the Year". This was the first year a PHRF boat was eligible for this honor, and was decided only after a post-season protest was decided and appealed. Witchdoctor won this honor the hard way, sailing only the minimum number of races required to qualify. Counting all four events entered, she managed to amass a twelve point margin over runner-up Orange Crate, a 36 foot sloop skippered by her designer and builder Jim Davis.

Qualifying events for the LEORC included the North Cape Yacht Club's Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry in its inaugural year, replacing the Mills Trophy which had been retired the previous year; the venerable Roberts Race held by the Cleveland Yachting Club; the Sandusky Islands Race co-sponsored by the Sandusky Yacht Club and the Sandusky Sail Club; two of the Lake Erie Race Feeders as well as the Lake Erie Race itself, spanning the 210 nautical mile length of Lake Erie and finishing at the North Cape Yacht Club; the Inter-Lake Yachting Association Regatta and Lakeside Yacht Club's Governor's Trophy Race. The best scores earned in four events were used in computing each entrant's total score.

The record of class winners appears elsewhere in the Yearbook. The total number of qualifiers may have been small, but easily made up in quality for any lack in quantity. Nowhere was competition more heated than in

the seven yacht IOR class A. These yachts differed no more than 2.5 feet in racing, and experienced unremitting head-to-head competition. Although large numbers of yachts participated in individual events, the number of PHRF entrants in the LEORC was small, reflecting the constituency of PHRF, which is predominantly club racers not interested in the demanding logistics of a campaign going the length of Lake Erie.

For 1980 some changes have been made to the Conditions for the Lake Erie Offshore Racing Championship. An eighth event, the Pascoe Cup held at Sandusky, has been added. Participation in five events is necessary to qualify. The schedule has been adjusted, through cooperation by all clubs sponsoring events included in the LEORC, to decrease traveling required between events on the circuit. The conditions for "Boat of the Year" have been tightened slightly, so that the "Boat of the Year" must now count its points in either the I-L.Y.A. regatta or the Lake Erie Race. IOR classes have been consolidated into one division, and there will be dual awards for "Boat of the Year" one each for an IOR and a PHRF winner. All skippers who enjoy the challenge of racing against Lake Erie's best racing skippers, in a season-long series, are urged to enter the LEORC this year. Entry information is found elsewhere in the Yearbook.

Historically Speaking

I-L.Y.A. 75 YEARS AGO

George H. Worthington of Cleveland Yachting Club was I-L.Y.A.'s 1905 commodore. He had been commodore once before in 1896 and was asked to take office again in 1908 and 1913, making him the only four-term commodore in I-L.Y.A.



history. Whatever Worthington did he Geo. Worthington - 1905 did in a dedicated manner, giving freely of himself and his worldly goods.

His vice commodore was Franklin H. Walker of Detroit Country Club who did not go in the flag line. The rear commodore, destined to succeed Worthington, was John F. Craig of Toledo Yacht Club. Warren J. Brodie of Lakewood Yacht Club was the secretary-treasurer while Myron B. Vorce, also from Lakewood Yacht Club, chalred the regatta. John Barth was entertainment chairman.

When Worthington was asked to take the helm again in 1905 he found a depleted treasury and the association records in such shape that a complete reorganization became necessary. It was up to Cleveland Yachting Club to pull I-L.Y.A. out of the hole. Worthington appointed committees that went to work with a will. The annual regatta was held at Put-in-Bay, July 24-29.

The 21-foot class that was so popular the year before dwindled to three entries. In the 18-foot class, Malillian, a Massachusetts Bay I-Class knockabout owned by George W. Hotchkiss of Lakewood Yacht Club, was the star performer with tremendous ability to claw to windward.

Sultana made a sweep in the 40-foot class. Two classes of powerboats were in competition, with Restless winning the race for the big fellows and Capitola Junior the event for power dinghies. It was a light air regatta with crews and skippers fruitlessly whistling for a breeze. The awards consisted of cups and flags for the champions and marine merchandise for second and third places.

The flagship was Worthington's huge schooner (and former contender for the America's Cup defense) Priscilla. No one who attended could ever forget the hospitality afforded aboard her. There were formal and informal receptions the entire week. To attract a record turnout, the commodore had the famed Verdi's Band play from Priscilla's foredeck every evening with the music ringing out over the waters of the Bay. At midweek, he presented a fantastic fireworks display from an anchored barge.

Warren Brodie did a splendid job of management. When the year ended the administration wound up with every bill paid including a good part of the debt left by previous administrations. Much of the cost was assumed by Worthington personally. When he turned the reins of the association over to Commodore John Craig, I-L.Y.A. was solvent once again.

I-L.Y.A. 50 YEARS AGO

In 1930, \$1,295 bought a fine 25 m.p.h. Chris-Craft runabout and Charley Thornburgh of Sandusky offered for sale his 47-foot cruiser, Marie II, for \$2,550. Edward E. Noble of Cleveland Yachting Club was elected commodore of I-L.Y.A. by its 34 member clubs. Albert Wakefield of

Vermilion Boat Club was vice commodore and Dr. J. W. Vaughn of Detroit Boat Club, rear commodore.

The regatta began with evening services at St. Paul's Church on Sunday, July 13. There was open house aboard the flagship, Pinafore, and the Yachtsmen's Dinner was held at the Crescent Hotel on Monday evening with T. B. Alexander in charge.

It was the time of radio and the new public address systems that sprouted everywhere including the I-L.Y.A. regatta. Enormous speakers, all due to the courtesy of Kaehni Brothers of Rocky River, spouted beautiful music day and night from the city dock. The Kaehnis were ploneers in radio and broadcasting development.

The ladies' lawn party was held at the Bayview Hotel, and the commodore's reception aboard the SS Chippewa with dancing in the moonlight and songs by the Ice House Gang from Toledo. Sail yacht races were scheduled for Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday. The commodores' and ladies' catboat races were held Thursday afternoon followed by the commodores' golf tournament. The Yachtsmen's Ball was held Thursday at the Colonial Pavilion. Friday the winners received their trophies at the Crescent and Saturday everyone cruised to Port Clinton Yacht Club.

There were sail races for the Rs, Club Kats and privately-owned Cats, Stars, cabin cats, dinghies, yawls, schooners, ketches and the great Universal Cruising Handicap Classes. There were 10 and 20 mile races for powerboats. Manufacturers, dealers and their representatives were expressly barred to keep the races Corinthian. The outboards raced in five classes including hydros and displacement craft.

Jim Poulos was operating his Put-in-Bay Cafeteria full blast as the island's favorite meeting place.

On Monday, July 14, there was a moment's pause as the I-L.Y.A. Commodores' Memorial Monument was unveiled in the park facing the Bay.

I-L.Y.A. 25 YEARS AGO

Lee Wilson of Cleveland Yachting Club was elected I-L.Y.A.'s commodore for 1955 by the delegates of its 67 member clubs, meeting at Detroit's Hotel Whittier. His vice commodore was Daniel K. MacBride of Portage Lakes Yacht Club. The rear commodore was Francis Martin of Detroit's Edison Boat Club.

I-L.Y.A. was given a permanent address at the Great Lakes Historical Society Museum in Vermilion. The Dragon was chosen as an official I-L.Y.A. sailing class. It was the year that Commodore Charles F. Stewart lost his life in a severe thunderstorm while racing off Mentor Harbor Yachting Club.

Hank Watterson and Clayton Bachtel of Cleveland Yachting Club headed the entertainment committee. They staged a pageant commemorating Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry's victory in the War of 1812 off Put-in-Bay - a victory that was the turning point of the war. The start of the pageant was a colorful Callithumpian parade.

An Appeal

To the Recording Secretary:

There is a need to communicate with I-L.Y.A. members who wish to appeal a decision of a Protest Committee to read the rules. We have received seven appeals this year, not a one of them filed according to the rules. In each case the protest loser has written to me, telling his tale and asking me to make it right.

USYRU Rules 77.2 and 78 are clear and spell out the procedure, which is: The appellant sends a Notice of Appeal to the original Protest Committee, stating that he wishes to appeal and his grounds. That Protest Committee then sends a copy of Notice of Appeal to all interested parties, requesting their comments and rebuttal to the Notice of Appeal. These replies, plus a copy of the written decision on the original protest, names, and addresses, etc., are then forwarded to the I-L.Y.A. Appeals Committee for hearing. The I-L.Y.A. Appeals Committee must have feedback from a sufficient number of people on both sides of the question, plus the committee, to decide whether or not the rules have been properly interpreted in the original decision. We cannot and will not operate outside the rules.

One other part of the appeal procedure is commonly misunderstood. The "facts found" as determined by the Protest Committee, are final and not subject to appeal. An appeal is a decision as to whether or not the applicable rules were properly applied to the "facts found". In many appeals the appellant is still arguing the facts, assuming if he can change the facts, he can change the decision, and it doesn't work that way.
