Wednespay, August 19Th, 2:30 p. m.

1. At 2:00 P. M. get under way for the starting line. Fleet will assemble off Gibraltar.
2. Columns will be headed West FROM NORTH TO SOUTH, arranged as follows:RED, then 400 feet further South GREEN, 400 feet further South YELLOW, 400 feet further South BLUE, 400 feet further South WHITE.
3. TAHOMA will be at white (A) buoy, Yacht " 1 R " will be at red (A) buoy.
4. Space between boats bow and stern one-hundred (100) feet.
5. Start on the gun. Make six miles per hour.
6. THE SUCCESS OF THIS DEPENDS ON YOUR COOPERATION, AND YOU MUST CHANGE SPEED SLOWLY.
7. TAHOMA heads for white (B) buoy, Yacht " 1 R " heads for red (B) buoy. The other columns remain at proper interval.
8. When the No. 8 boats have passed point "B" the TAHOMA will blow a long blast of the whistle. At the end of the blast, all yachts put your rudder full left and head South. This maneuver can well be called "boats left".
9. TAHOMA heads for red (C) buoy, Yacht " 8 W " heads for white (C) buoy. It will readily be seen that now we have eight columns and five lines. The distance between bow and stern is 400 feet. Don't get ahead of boat to your left and don't drop astern. The distance to the boat to your left is 100 feet.
10. (This will be pretty if done right.) As the yachts of each color arrive between the "C" buoys the yachts of that color turn $45^{\circ}$ to the left (No. 8 yacht slows down and immediately steers for buoy " D "). Then each yacht heads east when the white " C " buoy bears north. It will be seen that yachts No. 1, 2, 3, and 4 will have to speed up to cover the greater distance. Don't run ahead of yacht No. 8. Standard speed six miles.
11. (The TAHOMA will break ahead so as to get down to anchor near Gas Buoy.) Other yachts remain in formation and as they pass Commodore on TAHOMA fire a salvo when abeam of TAHOMA. At this point break formation.
12. A Coast Guard Officer in a speed boat will run around to assist you in maintaining position. Your cooperation with him will make this a success. If there are fewer than 40 yachts the No. 7 will be eliminated. Please display your cards prominently they must be seen by your neighbor.

All yachtsmen and their ladies must register.
All yachtsmen of the Inter-Lake and invited clubs, whether yacht owners or not, are invited and urged to participate in all of the events of the regatta and have their ladies participate wherever possible, to make the regatta successful in every way.

Obtain entry blanks, racing numbers and racing information at Headquarters.

Every yacht should be measured by the measurer of its home club and measurer's signature should be on entry blank.

Sign your entry and state clearly all answers to questions.
No entry fee will be charged in any event.
Get your entry in early to assist the committee.
Two or more entries must be received or an event will be cancelled.
Prizes in any event will be awarded according to number of entrants. If two entrants, only one prize will be awarded; if three entries, two prizes, etc.

Banquet Tickets, etc., may be purchased at Headquarters.
Postponements, changes in courses or events, results and all official announcements will be posted on the Bulletin Board at Headquarters. Watch it.

All events of the regatta will be started promptly on time. Be on your mark.

The official time used at meet will be Put-In-Bay Yacht Club time, according to clock at Headquarters.

## RACE COURSE PATROL. SIGNAL.S

## 2

The following sound signals will apply at all regattas patrolled by the United States Coast Guard Cutter TAHOMA in the calendar year 1936.

## LONG BLAST ON SIREN

The course is closed. No boats will be permitted to cross the course after this signal. Boats at anchor remain at anchor. Those not at anchor, drift (providing there is no possibility of their drifting across the course) or anchor.

## FOUR SHORT BLASTS ON TYPHON

Danger signal. Some boat is violating the rules. Each boat captain should check up on his own status when he hears this signal. Officers on patrol duty should look about for some boat that has violated or is violating the rules, or for some boat that is in danger.

## LONG BLAST ON STEAM WHISTLE

The race is finished and the course is open. If this signal is not heard do not presume and get underway, for if the races are close together this signal will not be given. Definitely the course is closed UNTIL you hear the long blast on the steam whistle of the TAHOMA.


In the interest of clarity absolutely $N O$ other sound signal will be made by the TAHOMA during or before a race.

## SEVERAL SHORT BLASTS ON THE WHISTLE OF A PATROL BOAT

Indicate that you are being hailed. If you are near such a patrol boat, or if you are the only boat in the vicinity of such a patrol boat, STOP. The officer on the patrol boat wants to talk to you. You are violating a law if you fail to stop when signalled to.

Spectator boats can readily recognize a boat having on board a Coast Guard Officer by the fact that such a boat carries a Const Guard Ensign.

I., on August 31st, under the auspices of the Bay Shore Yacht Club will be scheduled for Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons. High rig Star Class boats will be sailed in the trials.

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## RACING RULES FOR SAIL YACHTS

Certificate of measurement must be filed with entry. The Sail Yacht Regatta Committee reserves the right to order any yacht entered re-measured.

Races for all classes, starting five minutes apart on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings; starting time first class at $8: 55 \mathrm{~A} . \mathrm{M}$.
All races under Y. R. U. and I. L. Y. A. Rules, as amended to date.
In Class C. K. championship flag goes to skipper making highest parcentage, cup to club having highest percentage with three boats.

Entries for all point races must be made with Sail Yacht Regatta Committee at headquarters before 6 p. m. Sunday, Aug. 16 th, unless competing yacht arrives too late to enter before this time.
Alterations of the race program or sailing course may be made at the discretion of the Sail Yacht Regatta Committee. Such changes will be posted on Bulletin Board.
Numbers must be carried by each yacht on each side of its mainsail. These numbers will be supplied by the Sail Yacht Regatta Committee at Headquarters.
No person other than the Judges, Regatta Committee and Clerks will be allowed on Judges' boat without the consent of the Chairman of the Sail Yacht Regatta Committee.
All stakes to be left to port unless changed by Regatta Committec. If the Regatta Committee decides to reserve the course and have stakes left to starboard, a green flag will be flown from judges' boat. Red flag will mean all stakes to port. The judges' boat will fly a white flag with blue letters R. C.
Guns must not be fired from any yacht within one hour of the time of starting races, and not until after every yacht has crossed the finish line.
All vessels following the races must keep to leeward, and at such distance as not to interfere with the maneuvers of the competing yachts.

The races are open to every yacht which complies with the rules and which is regularly enrolled in any club in the lnter-Lake Yachting Association, Y. R. U., or which has been invited to participate in the races.
All boats sailing the long outside course will have four hours' time limit.
All boats sailing the short inside course will have three hours' time limit.

## Sailing Courses

The course for all, series races for sailing yachts in Classes R, 6 Meter 22 SQ, A, $\mathrm{L}, \mathrm{S}, \mathrm{Y}, \mathrm{SCH}$, and C will be triangular, starting from a line between a flag buoy off the east end of Gibraltar Island and a similar flag buoy in line with the west end of Middle Bass, to and around a stake three nautical miles N. N. W., thence to and around a stake three nautical miles $S$. W. three-quarters S., thence

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## RACING RULES FOR SAIL YACHTS

(Continued)
to and around a stake three nautical miles, E. one-half S. to and across starting line between starting stakes. In finishing yachts must cross the starting line in the opposite directions from which they start. All stakes must be left to port, unless otherwise ordered by the Sail Yacht Regatta Committee as heretofore provided.

The course for Classes, K, CK, CS, CC, ILSC, MS, and T \& D, starting from the same line, will be a shorter triangle with the same compass courses, but with one and one-half miles to the side, or a total of four and one-half nautical miles.

## RULES COVERING CLASS "Y" (CRUISING YAWLS)

All yachts in this class will be governed by the Y. R. U. rules, and will obtain their measurement rating under the Y. R. U. rules, with following exceptions:

Use of pot lead or similar compounds prohibited.
Measurement shall be determined with full cruising equipment aboard, and all such equipment shall be carried aboard throughout all races (not including dinghy).
Two per cent will be added to actual sailing time of yachts without engine as allowance to yachts with engine.
Yachts equipped with engine shall have engine sealed.
There will be no restrictions on the number of passengers carried in this class of races.
Class Star: Rules of the Star Class Yacht Racing Association to govern.

## TIME ALLOWANCE

Time allowance will be computed on all yachts in time allowance classes, under the formula and table of the Yacht Racing Union.

## WATCH BULLETIN BOARD

There will be a Bulletin Board at Headquarters where changes in program and special instructions will be posted throughout the regatta.
All yachts whose preparatory gun has not been fired must keep clear of starting line. Any yacht wilfully violating this rule will be disqualified.

Last year's simplified power boat racing rules will be enforced again this year, with some modifications. A goodly number entered last year but with the slight change in runabout classifications we hope to have more of the smaller boats in competition. All racing will be held on one day as per program. This will leave plenty of time to use the boats for pleasure. Join in the fun and show what your boat can do.
The cruisers will be rated according to the owners' declared speeds. They will be started on their handicapped time and should finish together. Runabouts will be raced in two classes according to their piston displacements and without handicaps.

1. Entrics for all power boat races shall be filed at Inter-Lake headquarters before $9 \mathrm{~A} . \mathrm{M}$. Tuesday, August 18.
2. There shall be two distinct heats for each class, the winners to be decided according to the point system of the American Power Boat Association.
3. All boats in the cruiser class shall start on their handicapped time. This time should be obtained at Headquarters or at the Judge's boat before 9:50 A. M.
4. Cruisers will be raced in two classes-A for boats of not over 12 miles per hour and B for boats of over 12 miles per hour speed.
5. Speed boats will be raced in two classes, under 325 cubic inches piston displacement and displacement boats unlimited.
6. All races shall be run over the same course of approximately $2^{1 / 2}$ statute miles to the lap.
7. Cruiser races, 5 miles total distance, twice around.
8. Speed boat races, 10 miles total distance, 4 times around.
9. Cruisers shall be rated for the first heat according to owner's declared speed, and any boat exceeding owner's declared speed shall be penalized by having the difference between declared speed and actual speed multiplied by two and added to the actual time.
10. Cruisers shall be rated for the second heat according to the fastest lap made in the first heat and the same penalties as to excess speed will apply as in the first heat.
11. Deliberate loafing on the course, running off the course, or turning, while in the race, in such a way as may interfere with other contestants, will be interpreted as infractions of the rules and any boats so doing are subject to disqualification by the judges.
12. If less than three boats enter in any class the judges may declare no race in that particular class.
